Budget Deviation for the Department of Administration

The Office of State Budget and Management (OSBM), as required by G.S. 143C-6-4(b)(3)(b1), must consult with the Joint Legislative Commission on Governmental Operations when a department's certified budget is expected to be exceeded by more than three percent (3%). Please see the budget deviation listed below for the Department of Administration, Temporary Solutions Division.

## **Department of Administration – Temporary Solutions**

Executive Order No. 4 requires all agencies that employ temporary employees to employ them through the Temporary Solutions Program, administered by the Office of State Human Resources (OSHR) under the authority of G.S. 126-4 (10). The impact of this directive has been to increase the workload as well as program expenditures and agency receipts associated with administering Temporary Solutions. OSHR seeks to increase both receipts and expenditures by \$15,662,250 million to accommodate agency needs for temporary employees. Since this budget action exceeds the three percent (3%) threshold, it is being submitted for consultation with the Joint Legislative Commission on Governmental Operations.
