RE: G.S. §114-2.5; Report on Settlement Agreement for Pharmerica

Dear Members:

Section 114-2.5 of the North Carolina General Statutes requires the Attorney General to report to the Joint Legislative Commission Governmental Operations and the Chairs of the Appropriations Subcommittees on Justice and Public Safety regarding all settlements and court orders which result in more than \$75,000.00 being paid to the State. Pursuant to that statute, I am writing regarding the settlement of claims for Medicaid reimbursement to the state and federal governments in the above-referenced matter. Pursuant to federal law (42 C.F.R. § 433.320) recoveries in these cases are shared on a pro rata basis by the state and federal governments.

A settlement has been executed between Pharmerica and the State of North Carolina.

The settlement resolves allegations that from October 1, 2001 through December 31, 2004, Pharmerica engaged in a kickback scheme with drug company Organon by receiving unlawful remuneration from Organon in the form of market share discounts and rebates in exchange for prescribing the drugs Remeron and Remeron Sol Tab to

residents in long term care facilities.

Under the terms of North Carolina's settlement, the State of North Carolina will recover \$479,396.60. Of that amount the federal government will receive \$256,609.94 for North Carolina's federal portion of Medicaid and Medicare recoveries. Pursuant to G.S. § 1-610, the qui tam plaintiffs whose whistleblower actions brought this matter to the government's attention will receive \$64,608.13 of North Carolina's recovery. The North Carolina Medicaid Program will receive \$87,244.18 as restitution. In addition, pursuant to Article IX, Section 7 of the North Carolina Constitution and G.S. § 115C-457.1, the penalty portion of the settlement in the amount of \$62,532.40 will be paid to the Civil Penalty Forfeiture Fund for the support of North Carolina public schools. Pursuant to G.S. § 115C-457.2 and G.S. § 1-608(c), the North Carolina Department of Justice will receive \$8,401.95 for investigative costs and costs of collection.
