These positions will be located in Disability Determination Services, Division of Vocational Rehabilitation, Department of Health and Human Services.

This Agency makes medical entitlement decisions on Social Security, Supplemental Security Income and Medicaid claims. Positions require the individual to learn medical criteria, policies and procedures, vocational guidelines, regulations and court rulings relative to social security and Medicaid disability claims development and adjudication to make a decision of entitlement.

These additional positions are required in order to maintain adequate processing of the projected claim receipts and to keep caseloads at a manageable level, to comply with Social Security Administration requirements for more detailed rationale that will increase the time required to document each case and lessen the number of cases each specialist can process timely and to meet timeframes set by court order.
