Grants Received by the NC Center for the Advancement of Teaching *Dr. Mary McDuffie, Executive Director, NCCAT* 

- ➤ \$57,954 remaining from Johnston, Martin, and Edgecombe counties for 10 one-day programs for up to 24 beginning teachers.
- ➤ \$2,616 remaining from the Progress Energy Foundation for a 5 day professional development seminar focusing on sustainable energy and the environment.
- ➤ \$78,995 remaining from the Golden Leaf Foundation to support National Board Support Seminars in Tier 1 tobacco-dependent, rural counties.
- ➤ \$8,760 remaining from Duke Energy to provide teachers with professional development in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics.
- ➤ \$119,735 remaining from the Z. Smith Reynolds Foundation for professional development for beginning teachers and data analysis.
- ➤ \$29,357 remaining from the Z. Smith Reynolds Foundation for professional development to 22 second and third year public school teachers from Tier 1 schools.

Note: Due to the transfer of NCCAT from the Board of Governors of the University of North Carolina to the State Board of Education in S.L. 2009-451 (S.B. 202), the remaining balances on the grants above need to be added to the Public Education budget.
