RE: G.S. §114-2.5; Report on Settlement Agreement for Aventis Pharmaceuticals

## Dear Members:

G.S. §114-2.5 requires the Attorney General to report to the Joint Legislative Commission on Governmental Operations and the Chairs of the Appropriations Subcommittees on Justice and Public Safety regarding all settlements and court orders which result in more than \$75,000.00 being paid to the State. Pursuant to that statute, I am writing regarding the settlement of claims for Medicaid reimbursement to the State and Federal governments in the above-referenced matter. Pursuant to federal law (42 C.F.R. § 433.320) recoveries in these cases are shared on a pro rata basis by the State and Federal governments.

On November 9, 2009, a Settlement Agreement was executed between Aventis Pharmaceuticals, Inc. ("Aventis") and the State of North Carolina. Aventis is a wholly-owned subsidiary of sanofi-aventis, U.S., LLC. Aventis sells pharmaceutical products. The settlement resolved allegations that between 1995 and 2000, Aventis and its corporate predecessors knowingly misreported best prices for the steroid-based anti-inflammatory nasal sprays Azmacort, Nasacort and Nasacort AQ. Under the Medicaid Drug Rebate Statute, Aventis was required to report to Medicaid the lowest or "best" price that it charged commercial customers and pay quarterly rebates to the Medicaid program based on those reported "best" prices.

Under the terms of North Carolina's settlement, the State of North Carolina recovered \$2,258,321.53. Of that amount, the federal government received \$1,401,245.03 to satisfy North Carolina's obligation to return the federal portion of Medicaid recoveries to the federal government. The North Carolina Medicaid Program received \$832,132.16 as restitution and interest. Pursuant to G.S. § 108A-70.12(b)(3), the North Carolina Department of Justice will receive \$24,944.34 for investigative and collection costs.
