Dear Representatives and Senators:

Please find the following report from the Conference of Clerks of Superior Court on the status of implementing protections against identity theft, pursuant to Senate Bill 1017, Session Law 2009-355, Section 4. A copy of this session law is attached.

North Carolina Clerks of Superior Court do not post images or copies of official records containing a person's social security or driver's license number on the Clerk of Superior Court's internet website available to the general public. Some Clerks choose to post a hyperlink to the Register of Deeds' public internet website for their country on the Clerk of Court website; however, the Clerk of Court is not responsible for the content of any official records that may be available through the Register of Deeds' website.

Each individual Register of Deeds may opt to provide accessibility to the NC Administrative Office of the Courts' civil case processing system (VCAP) through remote public access. There is no field within VCAP for NCDL numbers, however, there is a field for tax ID numbers.

The Conference of Clerks of Superior Court has consulted with the North Carolina Association of Register of Deeds (NCARD) and the NCARD submitted the attached memorandum and survey results (five pages total) as a response to the Conference's inquiry.

Please accept this report and the attached documentation as the official report regarding the study of the status of individual counties, judicial districts, Clerks of Superior Court and the Register of Deeds on the implementation of S.L. 2009-355.

## GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF NORTH CAROLINA SESSION 2009

## SESSION LAW 2009-355 SENATE BILL 1017

AN ACT TO ENHANCE PROTECTIONS AGAINST IDENTITY THEFT AND TO PROTECT THE CREDIT OF CRIME VICTIMS DURING THE PENDENCY OF CRIME VICTIMS COMPENSATION FUND APPLICATIONS AND APPEALS.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

## REPORT ON PROTECTIONS AGAINST IDENTITY THEFT

**SECTION 4.** The Conference of Clerks of Superior Court shall, in consultation with the registers of deeds, annually study the status of the individual counties and judicial districts as to whether or not the clerks of superior court or the registers of deeds are implementing this act and report results of the study to the Joint Legislative Commission on Governmental Operations on or before March 1 of each year.

## **EFFECTIVE DATE**

SECTION 8. This act becomes effective October 1, 2009.

In the General Assembly read three times and ratified this the 16th day of July, 2009.

SUBJECT: Redaction Study Report for the Joint Legislative Commission on Governmental Operations

During the 2009 Session of Legislature, SB 1017 (Session Law 2009-355) was passed to allow Registers of Deeds and Clerks of Superior Court the ability to remove, from an image or copy of an official record placed on an Internet web site, a person's social security or drivers license number contained in that record. The Registers of Deeds and the Clerks of Superior Court may apply optical character recognition technology or other available technology in order to, in good faith, identify and redact social security and drivers license numbers.

Upon passage, the North Carolina Association of Registers of Deeds (NCARD) and individual Registrars, made inquiries and gathered information regarding redaction. Several of the NCARD Committees, including, but not limited to, the NCARD Legislative Committee, the NCARD Executive Committee, and the NCARD Automation Technology Committee, met after passage of this Bill to ensure that compliance of this legislation could be achieved. Accordingly, there were concerns in the implementation of this Legislation. The main problems all Registrars and Counties faced were the pressing issues of money in an economically strapped economy, utilization of staff, additional redaction requirements over and above NCGS 132-10(g) and, a time frame to begin redaction. In gathering this information for a report to the Conference of Clerks of Superior Court prior to March 1, 2010, there were 100 of the 100 counties that replied to questions posed by the NCARD Automation Technology Committee. The redaction survey questions were:

- 1. How many redaction requests has your registry processed since NCGS 132-1.10 became effective on December 1, 2005? (This allowed to persons to request the Registers to removed information from their web sites by requesting, in writing, that the same be done.)
- 2. Are you already in the process of redacting? If so, for how long?
- 3. Are you planning to begin redacting? If so, when?

- 4. After consulting your vendor, county IT Department, or other service provider, please estimate two costs:
  - A. Redacting beginning with records on October 1 of this year (2009).
  - B. Redacting back to 1934, when Social Security began.
- 5. Does your office or your county have funding available to implement redaction?
- 6. If you do not have funding available, what is your view of whether the state should provide funding for the redaction has encouraged us to undertake?

In recapping the answers to the above questions, the following was realized from the 100 responses:

- 1. Total requests for redaction in 100 counties is 2,436.
- 2. Counties currently in process 17. How long varied from "upon request" to July 2005.
- 3. Plan to begin 28. When varied from "unknown, to next year.
- 4. Costs:
  - A. Beginning 10-01-2009 costs varied from 0 to \$125,000.
  - B. Redacting back to 1934 costs varied from 0 to \$920,000.
- 5. Funding available only 20 counties have funding (most using Automation Enhancement and Preservation Fund). Only a couple of counties said it would be in their budgets.
- 6. No funding, view of whether state needs to provide funding most counties replied in the affirmative as to asking for state funding for redaction of Internet records.

Pursuant to GS 132-1.10 Section 4, the NCARD hereby submits a recap to the Conference of Clerks of Superior Court on where the Registers of Deeds stand regarding the process of redaction. Upon obtaining information via a questionnaire posed to all 100 counties, the NCARD hereby submits those findings. (Attached copy of the replies of the 100 counties.)
