Rationale for Fee Increase: Few visitors are actually using the beach at Fort Fisher for all-night fishing. The park is experiencing increased vandalism in the form of tearing down fencing and driving through environmentally sensitive areas. This fee will bring the division in line with the practice of many coastal communities and help offset the budget shortfall.

Who Pays: Park visitors leaving the parking area and developed beach access area. Only those visitors driving four-wheel vehicles onto the open beach areas will be charged this fee.

Number Affected by Fee: Approximately 900 visitors will be impacted by this fee.
