Salary = \$70,000 plus benefits

As a Veterinary Risk Assessment Specialist, this position develops, coordinates and administers broad and complex veterinary bio-hazard risk assessment and vulnerability plans and programs, determines bio-security risks and vulnerabilities, and assists with risk assessment, vulnerability studies, bio-security vulnerability assessment training, risk and vulnerability data collection and processing in support of state wide risk and vulnerability reduction efforts and to support emergency response planning by NCDA&CS.

This position develops animal surveillance methodologies for the early detection of natural outbreaks of disease or intentional introduction of foreign animal disease and other bioterrorist agents. This position develops close working relationships between the NCDA&CS Emergency Programs Division and the Division of Public Health, NC Department of Health and Human Services (NCDHHS), as well as with all other state agencies, to

develop veterinary focused zoonotic bio-security risk and vulnerability assessments for animals, humans and facilities as well as develop general bio-terrorism threat vulnerability assessments, and terrorism threat reduction strategies and objectives. Through these steps the veterinarian in this position significantly improves the overall bio-security of North Carolina and reduces overall vulnerability of this state.
