The safety of the U. S. food supply is an extremely high priority for all consumers. Food safety and security is one of the most important missions for government at all levels. Food production and processing is a key component of North Carolina's agriculture industry. Outbreaks of foodborne illness strike fear in the public can severely damage or destroy businesses and the livelihood of many workers. Consumers turn to state and local governments for immediate response to illness or injury associated with retailers into the state. The unsanitary conditions and practices used by people from less developed countries can result in contaminated and unsafe products offered to North Carolina consumers. Whether it's a threat of intentional terrorism, an outbreak of listeria in dairy products, E coli in fresh produce or any other risk to public health from our food supply, this request for an additional Food Regulatory Specialist I will enhance our ability to prepare, detect and respond to new and emerging food safety challenges.

Most food regulatory specialists have approximately 220 establishments to inspect for food safety. One specialist currently has over 330 establishments and the supervisor in the eastern part of the state has over one hundred establishments to inspect in addition to his supervisory responsibilities. With this workload, the specialist cannot adequately cover the expected territory in a timely manner. In addition, the supervisor cannot spend time needed to train and supervise his employees to assure protection of the food supply.

This year we have had an increase in the U. S. Food & Drug Administration's request for contract inspections. Therefore, we are seeking to use the increased revenue which we are receiving from the FDA for food sanitation inspection work to add an additional Food Regulatory Specialist I to cover the counties of Northampton, Hertford, Bertie, Martin, Washington, Pitt and Beaufort. This will allow us to handle this additional workload but it will also lighten the workload of the over-burdened specialist and allow the supervisor to spend more time doing the training and monitoring that is required in his job.
