Rationale for Fee Increase: The Clean Air Act requires the Title V program to be funded entirely through Title V permit fees. The General Assembly has approved salary increases the last two years. These salary increases and other increased costs of operating the program must be funded without appropriations. Current Title V fee receipts are not sufficient to pay for the level of effort needed to maintain the program. The proposed draft rule amendments in 15A 02Q .0203 and .0204 should provide the needed funding for the foreseeable future into the future years.
