Explain Reason For Proposed Action: The proposed action is necessary in order for the Department of Cultural Resources to revise the fee structure for visitors to Tryon Palace Historic Sites and Gardens, which was last revised in 2000. In conjunction with the tricentennial of New Bern, Tryon Palace is opening a \$60 million History Education Center, substantially altering the visitor experience and the alternatives available to individuals, families, and students.

If the Rules Review Commission receives written and signed objections in accordance with G.S. 150B-21.3(b2) from 10 or more persons clearly requesting review by the legislature and the Rules Review Commission approves the rule, the rule will become effective as provided in G.S. 150B-21.3(b1). The Commission will receive written objections until 5:00 p.m. on the day following the day the Commission approves the rule. The Commission will receive those objections by mail, delivery service, hand delivery, or facsimile transmission.
