# What is Athletic Training

Athletic training encompasses the prevention, examination, diagnosis, treatment, and rehabilitation of emergent, acute, or chronic injuries and medical conditions. Athletic training is recognized by the American Medical Association (AMA), Health Resources Services Administration (HRSA) and the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) as an allied health care profession.

## Who We Are: Athletic Trainers Defined

Athletic Trainers (AT's) are highly qualified, multi-skilled health care professionals specifically trained in the prevention, examination, diagnosis, treatment and rehabilitation of medical conditions and emergent, acute, and chronic injuries. AT's provide care in collaboration with or under the direction of a physician, in accordance with their education, training and the state's statutes, rules and regulations. AT's collaborate with physicians to optimize activity and participation of patients across age and care continuums.

As a part of the health care team, services provided by athletic trainers include primary care, injury and illness prevention, wellness promotion and education, emergent care, examination and clinical diagnosis, therapeutic intervention and rehabilitation of injuries and medical conditions.


# There are 1,948 licensed athletic trainers in North Carolina and nearly 50,000 AT's practicing in the US.

# The Title of "Athletic Trainer"

The statutory title of "athletic trainer" is a misnomer. Athletic trainers provide medical services to all types of people - not just athletes participating in sports - and do not train people as personal or fitness trainers do. However, *the profession continues to embrace its proud culture and history by retaining the title.* In other countries, athletic therapist and physiotherapist are similar titles. The athletic training (AT) profession was founded on providing medical services to athletes.

#### **State Regulation of Athletic Trainers**

Currently, 49 states and the District of Columbia regulate the practice of athletic training. Individuals must be legally recognized by the appropriate state regulatory agency prior to practicing athletic training. The BOC exam is recognized by all Athletic Trainer state regulatory agencies to meet their exam requirement. Compliance with state regulatory requirements is mandatory and the only avenue to legal athletic training practice.



## **Athletic Training State Regulatory Boards**

Of the 49 states that regulate athletic training, every state is regulated by state licensure boards except, New York and South Carolina regulate with State Certification (South Carolina is currently working towards licensure). Hawaii regulates with state registration.

#### **Education of Athletic Trainers**

Currently athletic trainers must complete a master's degree in athletic training from a CAATE accredited college or university. The Commission on Accreditation of Athletic Training Education (CAATE) is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization currently incorporated in the State of Texas. The mission of the CAATE is serving the public and profession by establishing and ensuring compliance with accreditation standards that facilitate quality outcomes, continuous improvement, innovation, and diversity to enhance athletic training education. The CAATE is the agency responsible for the accreditation of more than 360 professional (entry-level) Athletic Training programs, 16 Post-Professional Degree Programs and 2 Residencies. The American Academy of Family Physicians (AAFP), The American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP), the American Orthopaedic Society for Sports Medicine (AOSSM), and the National Athletic Trainers' Association, Inc. (NATA), cooperate to sponsor the CAATE and to collaboratively develop the Standards for Entry-Level Athletic Training Educational Programs.

- Occupational health departments in commercial settings, which include manufacturing, distribution and offices to assist with ergonomics

- Youth leagues, municipal and independently owned youth sports facilities.


