As required by HB1150 Section 3.20 (c) the North Carolina Board of Architecture found it unnecessary to:

 Delay the collection, or modify the method of collection, of any fees, fines, or late payments assessed by the agency under its statutes, including the accrual of interest associated with any fees, fines, or late payments. (2) Delay the renewal dates of permits, licenses, and other similar certifications, registrations, and authorizations issued by the agency pursuant to its statutes. (3) Delay or modify any educational or examination requirements implemented by the agency pursuant to its statutes.

The Board arrived at this conclusion for several reasons, among them, construction was deemed an essential industry and architects are critical to the health, safety, and welfare of the public. The professional associations agreed with the Board decision. The Board has not experienced any significant reduction in applications or renewals.
