Section 2: Number of persons who applied for examination

The North Carolina State Board of Dental Examiners is a member of the American Dental Examination (ADEX) which has developed a clinical examination for dentistry that is offered in 35 states and is accepted in 45. Candidates for dental licensure do not apply directly to the Board for admission to the examination. Several thousand graduates of dental schools throughout the 35 member states are eligible to apply for licensure in NC upon passing the examination.

The Board accepts the Council of Interstate Testing Agencies (CITA) clinical hygiene examination for dental hygiene. Candidates for dental hygiene licensure do not apply directly to the Board for admission to the examination. CITA is a regional testing agency composed of seven member states (Alabama, Kentucky, Louisiana, North Carolina, Puerto Rico, U.S. Virgin Islands, and West Virginia). Applicants who pass the examination may apply for a dental hygiene license in any of the member states. In 2014, there were 355 applicants for the CITA dental hygiene examination.

Section 3: The number refused examination

Applicants are not allowed to apply for the examination until all educational prerequisites are met. Therefore, no applicants were refused admission to either the ADEX dental or CITA dental hygiene examinations.

Section 4: The number who took the examination

In 2014, CITA examined a total of 355 dental hygiene candidates from all seven member states and territories.

In 2014, several thousand candidates took the ADEX clinical examination for dentistry as offered by three regional testing agencies in 35 states.

Section 5: Number to whom initial licenses were issued

In 2014, 188 applicants applied for a dental license in North Carolina. All 188 were granted a dental license. Two hundred fifty-four [254] applicants applied for a dental hygiene license. All 254 were granted a dental hygiene license.

Section 5(a): Number who failed the examination

See attached reports from the three regional testing agencies (CDCA, CITA, and SRTA) offering the ADEX dental examination.

Twenty-five [25] candidates failed the CITA dental hygiene examination.

Section 6: Application for License by credentials

Licensure by credentials is the process through which licensees in other states may apply for a North Carolina license based on their experience and a safe practice record. No additional clinical examination is required for those who qualify. In 2014, 78 dentists and 71 dental hygienists from other states applied for licensure by credentials.

Section 7: License by Credentials Issued

In 2014, the Board licensed 77 dentists and 70 dental hygienists from other states through the credentialing process. One dentist and one dental hygienist who applied for licensure by credentials were denied.

239 complaints were received and investigated in 2014.

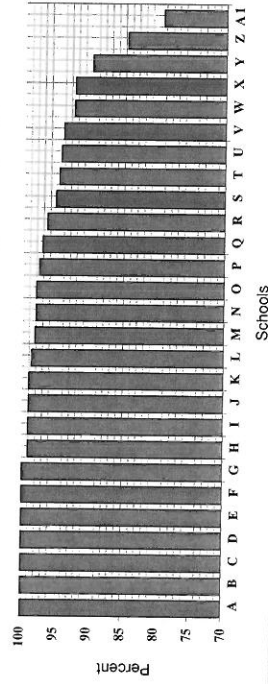
CIF Class of 2015 Examination
