The audit is in the process of being prepared by Bernard Robinson & Company, LLP and will be sent under separate cover.




Report of proceedings and activities of the

North Carolina Board of Examiners

Engineers and Surveyors

Fiscal Year 2013



The year 2013 was a very exciting year for the Board in several different and very distinct areas. The Board elected Willy Stewart as Chair of the Board. Mr. Stewart is the first Hispanic Chair in the Board's history. Gary Thompson, after serving 10 years as a Board member had his term expire. Mr. Andy Zoutewelle of Charlotte, NC was appointed by Governor McCrory to replace Mr. Thompson. The Board also had several members active in National Council of Examiners for Engineer and Surveyors (NCEES) activities and committees. Dr. Terri Helmlinger Ratcliff served as the NCEES Southern Zone Vice-President and served on the Foreign Experience Evaluation task force. Gary Thompson was elected to the NCEES Board as Treasurer. The Executive Director, Andrew Ritter was appointed as NCEES Chair for the committee for Member Board administrators.

The Board passed legislation to "grandfather" GIS practitioners. The legislation allows GIS practitioners who meet stringent criteria to waive out of the NCEES exams and the "grandfathering" window would expire July 1, 2014 at which time they would have to meet all license requirements in order to become licensed. The Board entered into a memo of understanding with the Japan PE/FE Engineering Council which allows qualified Japanese PEs to apply for comity in North Carolina.

In 2013 the Board continued its project to becoming environmentally efficient and paper free. Board and Board committee meetings transitioned to a paper-less format. Paperless renewals have remained at the 90% mark and licensees have been given the option to opt out of all paper communication with the board and instead receive all materials electronically. The Board also continued the transition to computer based testing as the NCEES exams will start to offer the FE and FS exams only on the computer in 2014. This transition includes re-writing the board's rules and laws concerning exam testing as well as re-writing the board's application procedures. Board staff has also begun an outreach program to insure all universities and students are aware of the transition of the exams to computer based testing.

The Board and its staff members participated as program speakers for PENC, ACEC-NC, NCSS, ASHRAE, ASME, ASCE, NCSU, numerous technical colleges, and state and local agencies. The Board participated in the Annual and Southern Zone meetings of the National Council of Examiners for Engineers and Surveyors. The Board also attended meetings of the Council of Licensure for Enforcement and Regulation and the Federation of Associations of Regulatory Boards. The Board also continues its program of licensure promotion. Board staff and Board members gave license promotion seminars to students at NCSU, Duke University, UNC-Charlotte, North Carolina A&T and to numerous community college programs.

The Board continues to take an aggressive approach with respect to the enforcement of the provisions of G. S. 89C and its role in protecting the public. The Board's violation section increased its productivity in 2013 as the Board now employs four full-time investigators. The Board also continues its proactive and educational approach to enforcement activities. The Board staff has given presentations and programs on the Board laws and rules and enforcement activities to code officials, inspection officials, Register of Deeds, affiliated trade associations and licensees across North Carolina.

VIOLATIONS ACTIVITY FISCAL YEAR 2013

I SUMMATION

During Fiscal Year 2013 Review Committees considered 122 alleged violations of Chapter 89C of the North Carolina General Statutes. All cases were investigated and processed through the Review Committees and recommendations as to the disposition of the cases were made to the full Board.
