

- (1a) The total number of licensees supervised by the Board is 1101
- (2) The number of persons who applied to the board for examination was 55.
- (3) The number who were refused examination is 2.
- (4) The number who took the exam was 98 - October 2020; 48 – March 2021.
- (5) The number to whom initial licenses were issued was 48.
- (5a) The number who failed the examination is 23.
- (6) The number who applied for license by reciprocity or comity was 18.
- (7) The number who were granted licenses by reciprocity or comity was 9.
- (7a) The number of official complaints received involving licensed and unlicensed activities was 1.
- (7b) The number of disciplinary actions taken against licensees, or other actions taken against non-licensees, including injunctive relief was 0.
- (8) The number of licenses suspended or revoked was 57.

(9) The number of licenses terminated for any reason other than failure to pay the required renewal fee was 0.
