Substance of any anticipated request by the Board to the General Assembly to amend statutes related to the Board: The Board requested a statutory change that will allow for a separate license for industrial refrigeration contracting work using ammonia as well as a separate license for repairs, maintenance and servicing only of commercial refrigeration was also requested. The Board also sought statutory authorization to raise its fee limits; the General Assembly adjourned without passing the bill.

Substance of any anticipated change in rules adopted by the Board or the substance of any anticipated adoption of new rules by the Board: The Board did not propose any rule changes in 2016.

Examinations are given by appointment in the Board office in Garner.

The Board has a website (<u>www.refrigerationboard.org</u>) where a register of all licensed refrigeration contractors may be found as well as the General Statutes and Administrative Codes pertaining to refrigeration, licensing information, CFC information and testing sites and information on various educational opportunities offered throughout the State for commercial refrigeration contractors.

The Board publishes a newsletter, "Refrigeration Up-Date". The newsletter is mailed to licensees, wholesalers, refrigeration instructors, mechanical and electrical inspectors, city and county managers and commissioners.

During 2016, the Board sponsored an educational meeting, Refrigeration Up-Date 2016, which allowed all attendees the opportunity to learn about new products in the refrigeration industry. Registration for the meeting was offered to all licensees, wholesalers, technical school instructors and their students, mechanical and electrical inspectors and other industry related individuals.

The Board continues to take an active role in keeping informed on the Clean Air Act of 1990 as it relates to the commercial refrigeration industry and in disseminating this information to its licensees, wholesalers, inspectors and the interested public. A library of up-to-date information is available for use at the Board office. The Board has been approved as an EPA Technician Certification Testing Agency under Section 608 of the Clean Air Act.

The Board sponsors an annual refrigeration scholarship initiated to assist students interested in the HVAC/R industry. Scholarships totaling \$1,500 were awarded to two students in the community college system during 2016.

Work continues on revising the commercial refrigeration examination to consolidate needed reference materials in an effort to hold down costs for technicians desiring to take the examination and to insure the most up-to-date materials are used.

Copies of the General Statutes, the Board Rules and the newsletter are available free of charge from the office of the Board.
