# Foundation of NC's Focus on Advanced Courses

- Legislation: Broaden Successful Participation in Advanced Courses (N.C.G.S.§115C83.4A)
- To increase access and successful participation in advanced coursework in NC's public schools
- Started May 2014; currently 4th full year
- Also focus of State Board of Education, NCDPI and Districts/Schools/Teachers

#### **Current Legislation**

- Provides NC public school students with AP/IB Exam Fees
- Establishes the NC AP Partnership with College Board, which provides technical assistance and professional development to targeted districts as well as state-wide.
- Ensures AP/IB Results in Report Card
- Provides for AP/IB Teacher Bonus Pay

This year, Cambridge International Exams will also be included.



# **AP Student Enrollment in At Least One AP Course**

Consistent growth annually in course enrollment across the state:

Academic Year	Number of Students	Increase
2013-2014	71,655	n/a
2014-2015	74,758	4%
2015-2016	77,392	4%
2016-2017	77,920	1% (8% in course enrollments)
2017-18 Current enrollments	82,311	5% (2% in course enrollments)
Overall Growth 2013-14 to 2017-18	15% growth in course enrollments

### **AP Program Highlights Overtime**

- Student Participation in Exams:
  - -57,002 NC public school students took at least one AP exam in 2013. That number has grown to 74,041 students in 2017.
  - -This represents a 30% increase of AP students since the AP Partnership has been in place.
  - -Many more NC public school students now participate in AP exams.

### **AP Program Highlights Overtime**

- AP Exam Participation:
  - -105,372 AP exams were taken by NC public school students in 2013. That number has soared to 138,282 exams administered to students in 2017.
  - -This represents a <u>31% increase</u> of exams taken since the partnership has been in place.
  - -More NC public school students are taking more AP exams.

### **AP Program Highlights Overtime**

- AP Exams Scoring 3 or above:
  - 58,571 examinees scores a 3+ in 2014. This performance metric has grown to 71,337 examinees scoring 3+ in 2017.
  - This represents a <u>22% increase</u> of examinees scoring 3+ since the partnership has been in place.
  - More NC public school students are achieving at higher rates than ever before in AP exams.

### Remarkable Highlight 2016-17

- AP participation and performance for Black and Hispanic students in NC's public schools continues to outpace the participation and performance for Black and Hispanic students seen nationwide.
- The number of Black AP Exam-Takers in North Carolina's public schools increased 5.9% from 2016 to 2017, as compared to a 5.0% increase in Black AP Exam-Takers in public schools nationwide.
- The number of Hispanic AP Exam-Takers in North Carolina's public schools increased 13.5% from 2016 to 2017, as compared to an 8.8% increase in Hispanic AP Exam-Takers in public schools nationwide.

### AP Courses through NC Virtual Public School


- 102 out of 115 NC School Districts partner with NCVPS to offer at least one AP course (97 in 2013)
- 34 Charter schools partner with NCVPS to offer at least one AP course
- Offer 20 AP courses
- Over 3936 students are enrolled (3100 in 2013)


#### **IB Student Course Enrollments**

Consistent growth annually in student course enrollments across the state:

Academic Year	Number of Students	Increase
2014-2015	15,178	n/a
2015-2016	18,524	22%
2016-2017	22,793	23%
2017-18 Current enrollments	20,161	-12% (note, enrollment still occurring)
Overall Growth 2014-15 to 2017-18	33% growth in course enrollments
