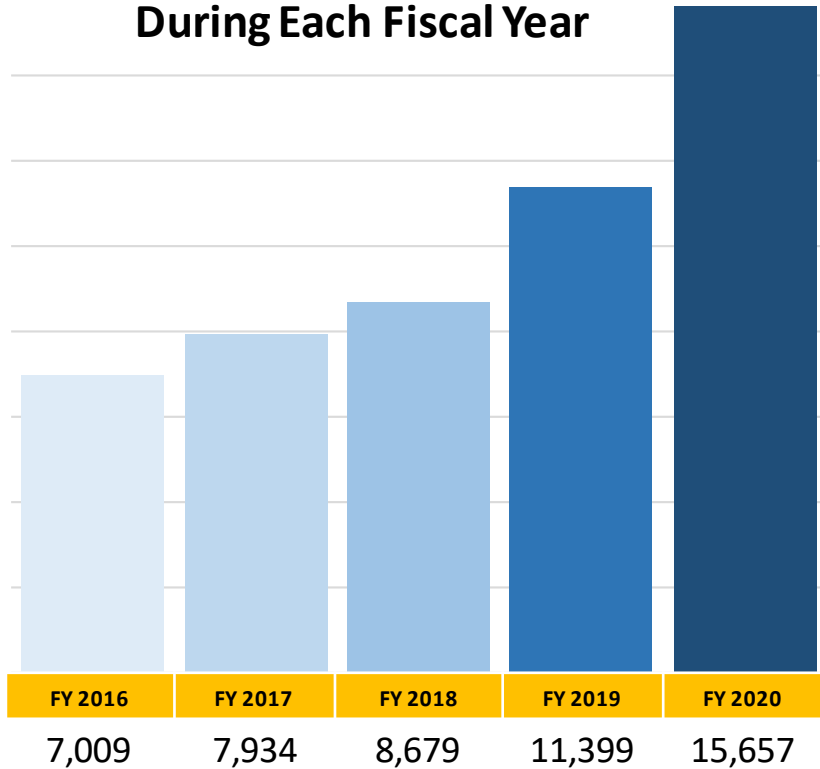

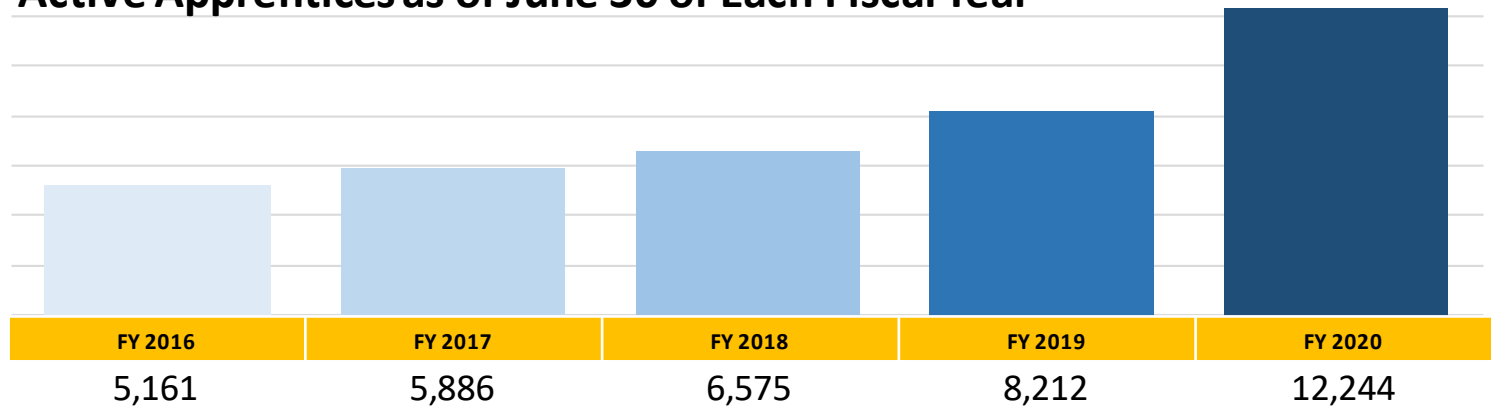

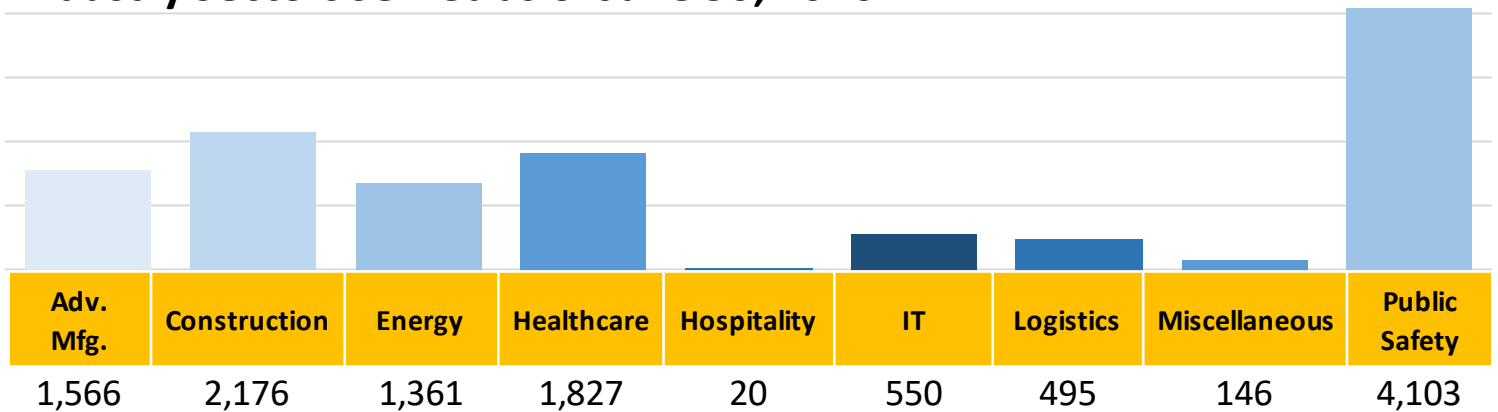
Apprentices Served During Each Fiscal Year

Youth Tuition Waiver

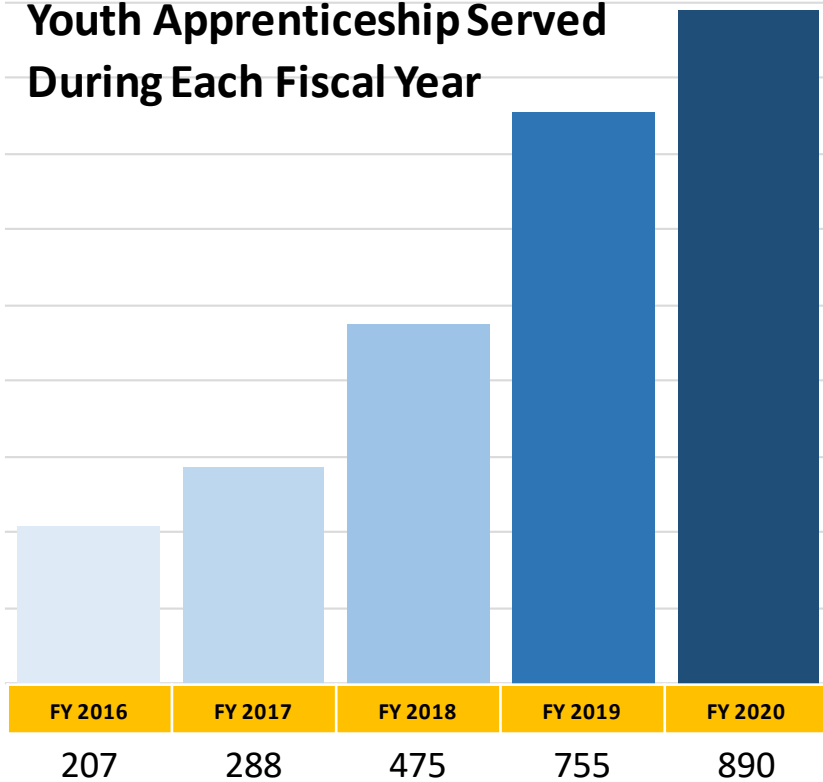
- Prior to HS graduation, students must be registered in either a Pre-Apprenticeship or Registered Apprenticeship program *and*
- Within 120 days of HS graduation, student must be enrolled in a Registered Apprenticeship program *and*
- Continuing his/her education at the local community college.



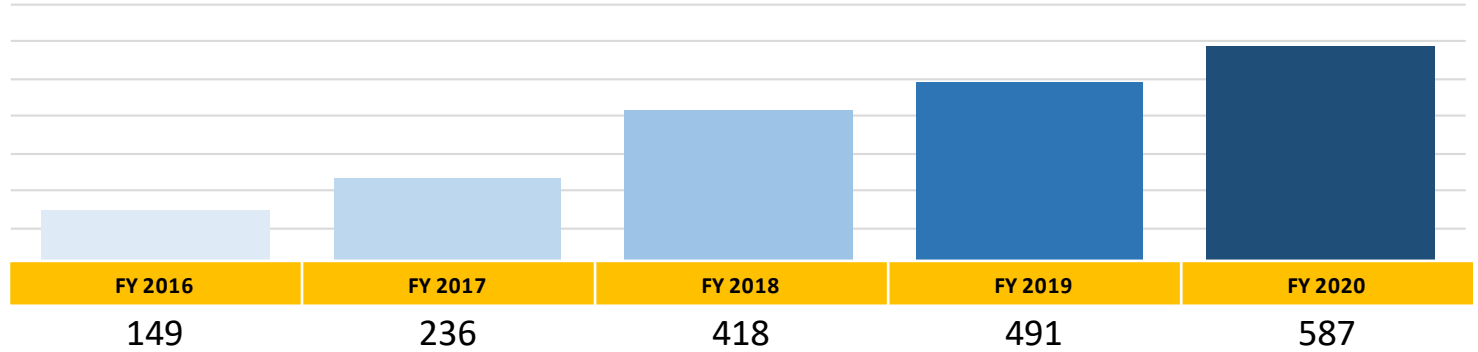

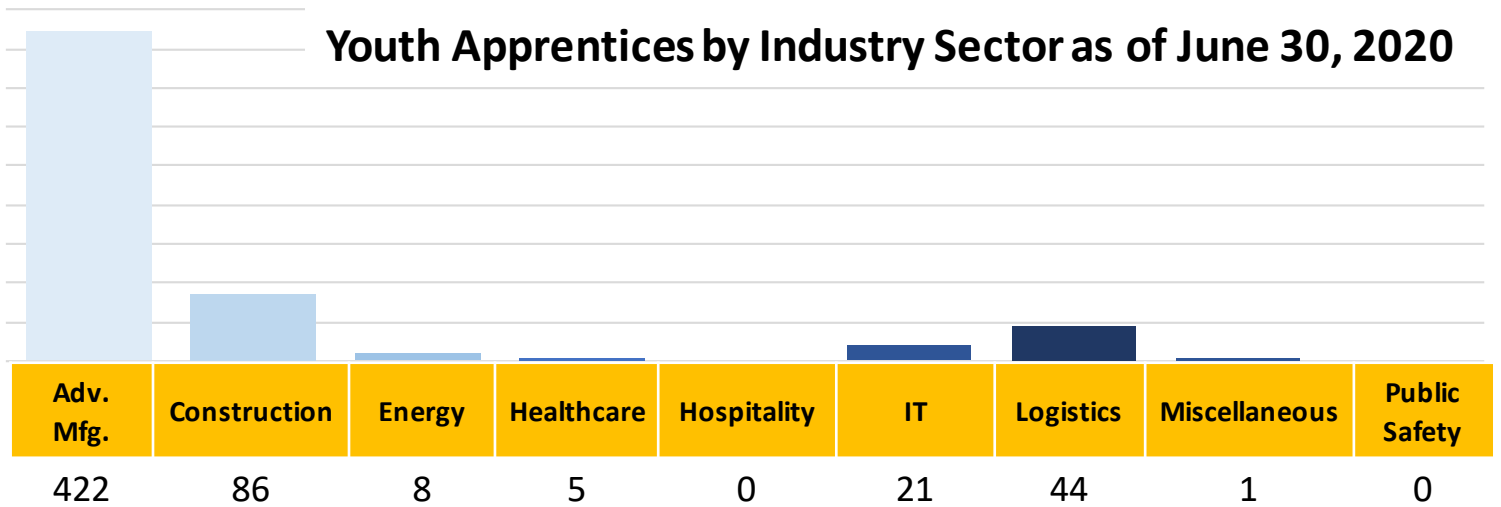
Youth Apprenticeship Served During Each Fiscal Year
