 - \$19 Million Received by NCVPS to Cover Instructional Cost of Courses

- 2) Whether NCVPS Monitors Course Quality in Accordance w/ Recognized Standards & Best Practices for Online Courses

NOTE: To Determine Whether Course Content & Design Met Standards OSA Contracted w/ Subject Matter Expert (SME)

FINDINGS:

1) Eight of 12 Courses Did Not Meet Required Curriculum Content Standards for Either 1) Instruction 2) Assessment, or 3) Both as Required by State Law and NCVPS Policy

RISK:

- Teachers Will Not Cover All of the Necessary Subject Matter
- Could Adversely Impact College & Career Preparedness for Students Enrolled in the Classes



FINDINGS:

- 2) 11 of 12 Courses No Assurance that Courses Met NCVPS Adopted Standards for Cognitive Rigor
 - 11 of 12 Courses Evaluated Found to be in Level 1 and 2 of Revised Bloom's Taxonomy

RISK:

Students Will Not Master Course Material

Note: Rigor – Complex Thinking & Application of Knowledge



Examples:

AP Art History - 100 % of Instruction - Low Rigor 52% of Assessment-Low Rigor

AP Environmental Science - 93% of Instruction – Low Rigor 51% of Assessment – Low Rigor

Physical Science - 59% of Instruction – Low Rigor 45% of Assessment – Low Rigor

FINDINGS:

- 3) NCVPS Teacher Evaluations Not Performed Consistently & In Accordance w/ Policy
- •622 Teacher Evaluations Review 2017-2018 School Yr
 - 136 Contained No Evidence of Review/Not Timely
 - 120 No Evidence Teacher Issues Were Addressed
 - 82 Contained Incorrect Ratings
 - 14 Missing Required Information



FINDINGS:

3) NCVPS Teacher Evaluations Not Performed Consistently & In Accordance w/ Policy (cont'd)

Risk:

- Poor Performance Will Not Be Identified & Corrected Timely
- Students Could Receive Substandard Instruction

FINDNGS:

4) NCVPS Course Content Not Properly Cited To Avoid Copyright Infringement

Examples:

- Questions on a Physical Science Assessment Found on Practice Test of Well-Known Educational Publisher
- Question on Pre-Calculus Assessment Found in Lesson Published by Another Educational Publisher
- Introduction to a Module in African-American Studies Course Found in a Book About African contributions to American Culture

Risk: Potential Litigation from Publishers & Authors
