

North Carolina House Bill 1473 provides for \$12M in recurring funding that...





Towards Equity of Access




The Education Network




Core Recommendations


- Fund LEA connectivity costs

Accomplishments [2]

- Initiated, funded, and deployed dozens of pilots and upgrades across the state
- Visited over 40 high priority LEAs since August
- Filed consortium E-rate documents for connecting all LEAs to the statewide backbone
