Every public school student will graduate from high school globally competitive for work and postsecondary education and prepared for life in the 21st Century.

Goal One from State Board's Strategic Plan

North Carolina will produce Globally Competitive students.

Rationale for Increasing Standards

- Competition from other states 29 states representing 60% of students have already or are in process of raising standards

- 4 Mathematics
- 4 English Language Arts
- 3 Science
- 3 Social Studies
- 1 Health & PE
- 6 Electives:
 - 2 CTE, Arts, or Second Language
 - 4 course concentration based on student interest strongly recommended

Personalized Math Sequences

- Workforce
- Community College
- Liberal Arts Major
- Math/Science/Tech Major

Opt Out

- Available for students for whom the Future-Ready Core is not appropriate
- Group decision—student, parent, counselor, administrator, teacher
- To be monitored

Timeline

Beginning with Freshman Class of 2009

Preparation for Core

- Extensive communication plan with middle school students & parents
- Extensive training of guidance counselors, teachers and administrators in middle and high schools
- Complete course review of existing courses

Preparation - cont.

- Development of new courses/math sequences and assessments
- Provide extensive professional development in teaching strategies to engage learners
