


AVID: 27 Years of Success

• one of the most successful collegepreparatory programs ever for low-income, underserved students


• serves more than 300,000 students

NORTH CAROLINA DISTRICTS







What is AVID?

- A structured, college preparatory system working directly with schools and districts
- A direct support structure for first-generation college goers, grades 4-12
- A schoolwide approach to curriculum and rigor
- A professional development program providing training throughout the U.S.



What is AVID?

Support structure for all students, and most especially the least served students in the "academic middle":

- **AVID** is an academic elective
- **AVID** students enroll in an intensive set of courses
- Students learn explicit skills for success in these more rigorous courses
- Trained college tutors lead group tutorials in the academic elective




AVID Graduates


- 98% plan to enroll in a college or university
- 67% plan to enroll in a four-year university
- 31% plan to enroll in a two-year college
- 84% of parents have less than a four-year college degree


NC Graduation Rates




Lenoir County – EOC Data



Onslow County Middle School Attendance Rates




Onslow County High School Attendance Rates




Onslow County EOG Results




Durham 2006-07 EOC Data




Asheville HS African American English 1 EOC

Asheville HS African American Geometry EOC






Why AVID Works
