DROPOUT PREVENTION GRANT APPLICATIONS 2007 and 2008



Committee Appointments

- 5 appointed by the Governor (*One appointment remains vacant.*)
- 5 appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate
- 5 appointed by the Speaker of the House
- The co-chairs are designated by the President Pro Tempore and the Speaker

Powers and Duties

- Determine which LEAs, schools, agencies, FBOS and CBOs qualify for funding under the 2008 legislation
- Report to the Joint Legislative Commission on Dropout Prevention
- Hold regular meetings
- Select grant recipients



The Dropout Prevention Grants of 2007 and 2008

An Historical Perspective

- 2007
 - Establishment of the Dropout Prevention Committee and the Dropout Prevention Grant by legislation
 - Creation of North Carolina's first Dropout Prevention Grant Application
 - Forty grant applications are approved by the Dropout Prevention Committee in accordance with criteria set by legislation
 - Funds to awardees are issued by year's end



The Dropout Prevention Grants of 2007 and 2008

An Historical Perspective

- 2008
 - Re-establishment of the Dropout Prevention Committee and the Dropout Prevention Grant by Legislation
 - Meetings held in September to organize the process for awarding grants to 2007 unfunded grant applicants, for granting continuing funds to 2007 grant awardees, and for awarding grants to qualifying 2008 applicants
 - Extension for distribution of funds is granted
 - Dropout Prevention Grant of 2007 is modified for 2008
 - 2007 Awardees are notified to turn in a progress report
 - Meeting held in September and October to identify which 2007 Unfunded Applicants will be awarded grants
 - Funds to awardees are expected to be issued before year's end

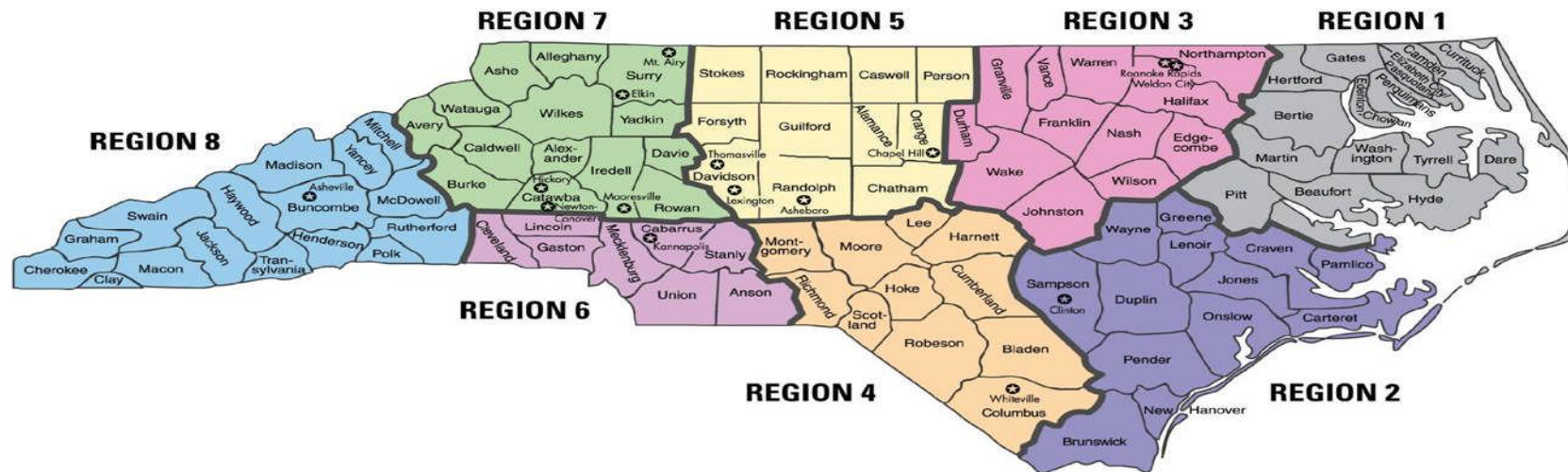


Timeline of Activities

Special Criteria for New Round of Applicants (According to the 2008 Legislation)

- Must *not have applied* in 2007
- Meet the new cut-off score
- Serve students “in local schools that have a four-year cohort graduation rate of less than 65%.”

Special Criteria for Unfunded 2007 Applicants

- Meet new cut-off score
- Serve students “in local schools that have a four-year cohort graduation rate of less than 65%.”



Criteria for Awarding Grants to the 2007 Unfunded Applicants

- Programs that serve students in local schools that have a four-year cohort graduation rate of less than sixty-five percent (65%)
 - Programs/Initiatives serve in areas/counties not previously funded
 - Strong focus on academics with components that include tutoring, mentoring for students at-risk of failing
 - Demonstrated levels of need (i.e., low-wealth counties, areas with high poverty rates)
 - Number of students served
 - Collaboration with other community services and agencies
 - Evidence of parental involvement
 - Notable level of innovation
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Criteria That All Grant Types Must Meet

- Award amount can be up to \$150,000
- Program/initiative must be innovative and sustainable
- Program/initiative must be less than five years old
- Can be one of 3 grantees in a county
- Students are held to high academic standards
- Statements of how funds will be expended and coordinated with other existing funds



Criteria That All Grant Types Must Meet

- Program/initiative must use best practices for increasing student achievement, keeping students in school, or helping students re-enter
- Demonstrated local community input
- Demonstrated need to increase attendance, parental involvement, graduation

NOTE: All applications and progress reports are due October 31, 2008.



Components of the Evaluation Process

(What All Applicants Must Address)

- How funds were used
- Success of the program/initiative
- How the program/initiative impacted student attendance, test scores, graduation rates
- Program's impact on existing programs, services



Components of the Evaluation Process

- Sustainability
- Demographics of students served
- Program's potential to serve as a model for achieving academic progress
