Why Learn about China?

- ▶ North Carolina's 2nd largest export market
- ▶ \$1.9 billion exported to China in 2008 four times the 2002 export level
- China buys nearly 10% of all N.C. agricultural exports
- ▶ 1/3 of world's people speak Mandarin




Confucius Classroom Initiative
