## Multi-Campus Colleges

- State Board-approved convenience locations where students may complete certificates, diplomas, and associate degrees as well as access literacy and continuing education courses.
- 32 Approved Multi-Campus College locations at 20 colleges.



#### **Approval Criteria**

- Population Base/Student Demand
- Must offer at least one complete Associates Degree at the MCC campus.
- Programs and Services Meet Accreditation Requirements
  - Must offer comprehensive instructional support functions such as libraries and student services.
- Must serve at least 300 full time equivalent (FTE) students.

Goal: Provide appropriate geographic access, while minimizing unnecessary duplication of facilities and services.



## Multi-Campus Formula

- Each MCC is eligible to receive an allocation equal to the lower of:
  - The budget FTE served at the MCC site multiplied by the Institutional Support Enrollment Allotment value (\$1,386 for FY 2009-10); or
  - The maximum allocation based on the MCC's level as defined below:

MCC Level	Budget FTE	<u>Maximum</u> <u>Allocation</u>
Level 1	Less than 500	\$525,000
Level 2	500 to 799	\$575,000
Level 3	800+	\$625,000



## **Funding Challenges**

- Colleges are not receiving full amount for which they are eligible:
  - MCC formula was not fully funded for FY 2009-10
  - No funding has been appropriated for 7 approved MCC locations:
    - Western Stanly Campus at Stanly CC
    - Highway 29 Business and Technology Campus at Rowan-Cabarrus CC
    - Cloverleaf Plaza Campus at Rowan-Cabarrus CC
    - Macon County Campus at Southwestern CC
    - Public Safety Training Center at Wake Technical CC
    - Transylvania Center at Blue Ridge CC
    - Northwest Guilford County Campus at Guilford Technical CC



#### Recommendation

- Include adjustments necessary to fully fund the MCC formula in future continuation budgets:
  - Fully fund existing campuses: \$ 985,097
  - Fully fund 7 unfunded campuses: \$2,987,542\$3,972,639



## Report Highlights

- Seven approved Multi-Campus College (MCC) locations are not currently funded.
- The MCC formula is **not fully funded** even for currently funded locations.
- **\$4 million** is needed to fully fund all approved MCC locations consistent with MCC formula.
