- Determine the academic disciplines needed and ensure the University is meeting current and projected workforce demand

- Produce quality students for the state's workforce
- Understand what skills are needed and then meet the demand

3. Serve the People of North Carolina

 Understand how best to continue using University resources, including our faculty expertise, research, and service capacity to improve the lives of North Carolinians

 Continue to identify and act on specific opportunities for savings in academic and administrative areas

5. Ensure an Accessible and Financially Stable University

 Increase the University's capacity to secure external funding support and grow partnerships with the private sector

Strategic Planning Process Advisory Committee

- Composition: 33 members
 - Government leaders
 - Business leaders from across North Carolina
 - Board of Governors members
 - Chancellors
 - Faculty, staff, and student leadership

Current Budget and Policy Focus

- Enrollment Funding:
 - Transitioning to a performance based enrollment model
- Operating funds for facilities
- Financial Aid
- Repairs and Renovation needs (\$2.3 billion across 17 campuses)
- Potential programs focused on economic needs of North Carolina

Budget and Policy Development Timeline

- Budget and policy proposals reviewed: November December and analysis complete after strategic plan finalized
- Budget and policy recommendations approved by Board of Governors in early 2013
