Opportunities

Weaknesses

- Rapidly-changing workforce and society
- Complex governance structure lacks accountability
- Fragmented, often short-term funding
- Need for teacher and leadership development

Threats

- **Distrust** between educators & policymakers
- Lack of a comprehensive education vision to drive and explain policy and practices
- Challenges of collaboration & continuity
- Centralized state policy = large-scale change
- Uncertain revenue picture
- Varied districts require tailored local implementation



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



Teacher and Principal Impact on Student Learning






