
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Communities In Schools of North Carolina

- Established in 1989, the organization's mission is to surround students with a community of support, empowering them to stay in school and achieve in life. CIS is considered the leading dropout prevention program in the nation.
- CIS site staff work with school administrators to identify school-wide needs such as violence prevention, combating truancy, increasing graduation rates and identifying students in greatest need of targeted services.



Innovation and Impact

READS for Summer Learning – developed by Dr. Kim, an associate professor at Harvard – is designed to improve reading comprehension during the summer learning gap.

- 8,000 kids in 59 schools
- 45,000 matched-books

Performance Learning Centers (PLC)

Nearly 2,000 graduates to date86.5% graduation rate





Model of Service

- Effective: Placing a caring adult inside a school who is trained on best practices for serving students and linking them to a full spectrum of resources in the community.
- Efficient: CIS stretches every dollar invested by the General Assembly to create \$20 worth of student supports and services.
- Evidence: The CIS model for integrated student supports works. Data proves the impact of our collaborative efforts.







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

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
Number of Students Served 2008 - 2013
