North Carolina Education Lottery Scholarship Annual Report for 2018-19 February 28, 2020

The North Carolina Education Lottery commenced in March 2006 and the North Carolina State Education Assistance Authority (Authority) began identifying recipients for the North Carolina Education Lottery Scholarship in February 2007 for the 2007-08 academic year. The 2018-19 academic year was the twelfth academic year in which recipients were funded with lottery proceeds.

The North Carolina Education Lottery Scholarship is designed to ensure that eligible students whose families can afford to contribute less than \$5,000 toward the student's education will receive at least a certain minimum amount of grant funding not to exceed \$4,000 when combined with the Federal Pell Grant. For the 2018-19 year, the minimum combined grant amount was \$3,997.

The eligibility criterion referenced above is set out in NC General Statute § 115C-499.2 and was adjusted recently for inflation by S.L. 2019-235; the update will enable more students to receive funding effective for the 2020-21 academic year.

Students apply for the Education Lottery Scholarship by completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), which is required to be considered for all federal and state need-based aid. Consideration for the scholarship occurs automatically based on data on the FAFSA, and students are notified of their eligibility by the institutions to which they apply. Funds are disbursed to the institutions upon confirmation from each institution that the student is enrolled.

The Education Lottery Scholarship serves students enrolled in public institutions of higher education. For the 2018-19 academic year, all 22,928 eligible students received funding totaling \$24,754,093 with an average scholarship of \$1,079. Of the total recipient count, 56% were enrolled in a University of North Carolina institution and 44% were enrolled in a North Carolina community college.

The Authority receives funds quarterly from the North Carolina Education Lottery Commission and places the funds in a trust fund for the benefit of eligible students.
