STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION

STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION VISION: Every public school student in North Carolina will be empowered to accept academic challenges, prepared to pursue their chosen path after graduating high school, and encouraged to become lifelong learners with the capacity to engage in a globally-collaborative society.

STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION MISSION: The mission of the North Carolina State Board of Education is to use its constitutional authority to guard and maintain the right of a sound, basic education for every child in North Carolina Public Schools.

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§ 115C-174.26. ADVANCED COURSES

In response to G.S. 115C-174.26, the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction (NCDPI) initially established the NC Advanced Placement Partnership (NCAPP) in May 2014 with the College Board. The NCAPP continues with its purpose to broaden access and successful participation in advanced coursework in North Carolina's public schools. According to G.S. 115C-174.26, "it is the intent of the State to enhance accessibility and encourage students to enroll in and successfully complete more rigorous advanced courses to enable success in postsecondary education for all students." NCDPI's Division of Advanced Learning and Gifted Education serves as a liaison with AP/IB/CIE organizations, providing monthly updates on critical issues and working with districts to discuss issues of equity and excellence in advanced programming.

The NCAPP continues to respond to the legislation through various efforts. In 2020-21 twenty-one NC school districts participated in the NCAPP as "targeted districts" with focused support and technical assistance. For this 2021-2022 academic year, the same twenty-one districts are participating with the NCAPP as targeted districts, and most have been designated low-performing districts. Currently, there are three full-time staff dedicated from College Board to the NCAPP. NCAPP also provides statewide support through professional development opportunities for all public school districts across the state, both face-to-face and virtual. College Board and the NCDPI are continuing to work together on these various aspects to ensure continued success of the NC AP Partnership.

In addition, the General Assembly continues to appropriate funds for all Advanced Placement (AP), International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IB), and Cambridge Assessment International (AICE) exams for public school and charter school students who were enrolled in the corresponding AP/IB/CIE courses. This funding began with AP and IB for the 2014-15 school year, with Cambridge included in this effort beginning the 2016-17 school year.

Alongside NC's public school districts, the NCAPP spearheads NC's progress with AP course enrollment and AP exam participation and performance. Overall across the state, there were decreases this past year, likely due to the lingering impact of COVID-19. However, there was an increase in the number of Hispanic AP exam-takers in North Carolina for the 2020-2021 school year.

Below are some key highlights that are detailed further in the report:

- The pandemic impacted AP scores for almost all demographic subgroups. There was a 9% decrease
 in performance on 2021 AP exams compared to the 2019-2020 school year. AP performance in NC
 decreased; however, the declines were less than decreases seen nationally in almost all subgroup
 areas.
- The number of AP Exam-Takers in North Carolina's public schools decreased 0.3 % from 2020 to 2021, as compared to a 4.4% decrease in AP Exam-Takers in public schools nationwide. In total 70,038 NC public school students took 125,787 AP exams, with 61,819 receiving a proficient score. This represents a 1.1 % decrease of exams taken, and a 16.1 % decrease of exams attaining a 3+ score over last year, compared to a 18.2% national decrease in exams attaining a 3+ score over last year.
- One notable increase: AP participation and performance for Hispanic students in North Carolina's public schools was higher than the participation and performance for Hispanic students seen nationwide. The number of Hispanic AP Exam-Takers in North Carolina's public schools increased 2.8% from 2020-2021, as compared to a 5.4% decrease in Hispanic AP Exam-Takers in public schools nationwide. The number of Hispanic students' exams attaining a 3+ score decreased 22.9% over last year in NC, outperforming the 30% decrease for the same group nationwide.

 Currently in 2021-2022, 72,577 students are taking at least one AP course. These students represent 133,732 AP course enrollments in NC public schools. This represents a decrease of 7.1% of individual students taking at least one AP course compared to last year's enrollment of 78,174 students.

The overall effort to broaden access and successful participation in advanced courses has been a result of diligent work by NC's teachers and districts and the investment by the state of NC. NCDPI will be working with College Board and school districts to further examine the changes in the data to ensure even more intentional strategies to support growth are utilized. With NCAPP's sustained efforts of professional development and technical assistance to support implementation, the State Board of Education (SBE) and NCDPI will continue efforts to increase access and successful participation in Advanced Placement courses across NC.

STATUS AND EFFORTS OF THE NCAPP

NCAPP TARGETED DISTRICTS

NCDPI and College Board agreed that the twenty-one school districts that participated 2020-2021 continue with the NCAPP for 2021-2022. The current 21 target school districts are low-performing in the areas of ACT composite, math rigor, overall performance composite scores, and AP participation and performance. Each year, NCAPP and NCDPI will continue to re-evaluate the districts participating based on new levels of need to ensure effective implementation.

NCAPP STATE-WIDE EFFORTS

In addition to focused district support through professional development and technical assistance, NCAPP continues to work with state-wide efforts as well. Particularly, each school district across the state is invited to send a select number of high school AP teachers to participate in content-based professional development opportunities throughout the year. Due to the ongoing impact of COVID-19, face-to-face professional development opportunities were cancelled. However, NCAPP used the funds to host virtual Spring AP One-Day Workshops, to host a virtual Middle Level Colloquium, to support virtual Advanced Placement Summer Institutes (APSI) for which 618 scholarships were awarded, to launch an AP Summer Refresher Series for teachers, and to host an AP Teacher Symposium that is continuing throughout the year as an AP Best Practices Series. This series supports teachers throughout the school year using the AP instructional materials developed through College Board and launched in 2019. State-wide efforts with regional technical assistance through the SBE regions and webinars for administrators and district teams continue to provide support for systemic change and program development.

NCDPI RESPONSE TO NCAPP REPORT

NCDPI received the College Board's NCAPP Annual Report in October 2021. The report reflects the progress of the NCAPP for the last year as well as exam performance information. NCDPI is pleased that College Board and the NCAPP team continue to find new ways to support teachers and districts through unprecedented times.

For the May/June 2021 AP exams, College Board again responded to the persisting COVID-19 interruption by providing intentional supports for teachers and students to continue instruction. Additionally, AP exams returned to full-length exams, and schools were provided a flexible AP exam schedule that offered traditional paper and pencil as well as digitally-administered exam format options for students. The College Board is

committed to serving NC public school districts and continues to partner with NCDPI to ensure effective implementation.

DISTRIBUTION OF NCAPP FUNDING FOR AP, IB, AND AICE EXAM FEES

For the payment of AP exams for the May-June 2021 exam administration, NCDPI paid College Board \$12,115,114 to support NC's public school students and families. NCDPI and College Board have developed a state-wide invoicing system to facilitate effective payment and lessen the burden on high schools and their districts.

NCDPI particularly notes the continued success of the implementation of the state-covered AP exam fees. College Board and NCDPI continue to work together with NC's school districts, high schools, and charter schools to improve this process. NCDPI appreciates the hard work of all involved to ensure that students' exam fees were covered.

For the payment of the IB Diploma Programme exams and fees for the May 2021 exam administration, NCDPI paid the International Baccalaureate Organization (IBO) \$1,054,438 to support NC's public school students and families. NCDPI and IBO have developed a full state invoice process to better facilitate payment and lesson the burden of billing on high schools and their districts.

For the payment of Cambridge International exams and fees for the May 2021 exam administration, NCDPI paid Cambridge University \$54,570.87 to support NC's public school students and families.

AP/IB/CIE CURRENT COURSE ENROLLMENT DATA

Currently in 2021-2022, there is a decrease in the number of students taking at least one AP course and a decrease in course enrollments compared to last school year. This year 72,577 students are taking at least one AP course. These students represent 133,732 course enrollments. This represents a decrease of 7.1% in the number of students with a decrease in 8.6% in course enrollment from last year.







AP Exam Performance (see p. 4 - 25 for school level details):

The number of AP Exam-Takers in North Carolina's public schools decreased 0.3 % from 2020 to 2021, as compared to a 4.4% decrease in AP Exam-Takers in public schools nationwide. In total 70,038 NC public school students took 125,787 AP exams, with 61,819 receiving a proficient score. This represents a 1.1 % decrease of exams taken, and a 16.1 % decrease of exams attaining a 3+ score over last year, compared to a 18.2% national decrease in exams attaining a 3+ score over last year.

- AP performance for Black students in North Carolina's public schools outpaced the performance for Black students seen nationwide. Black students' exams attaining a 3+ score decreased 30% over last year in NC, as compared to 31.7% decrease for the same group nationwide. The number of Black AP Exam-Takers in North Carolina's public schools increased 0.9% from 2020 to 2021, as compared to a 1.4% increase in Black AP Exam-Takers in public schools nationwide.
- AP participation and performance for Hispanic students in North Carolina's public schools continues to
 outpace the participation and performance for Hispanic students seen nationwide. The number of
 Hispanic AP Exam-Takers in North Carolina's public schools increased 2.8% from 2020 to 2021, as

Students taking the SAT with the PSAT/NMSQT as a Junior and Sophomore or younger continue to score higher than the national average (SAT Evidence-Based Reading and Writing 578 – 36 points higher than the national average; SAT Mathematics 571 – 39 points higher than the national average) while students taking the SAT without the PSAT/NMSQT continue to score lower than the national average (SAT Evidence-Based Reading and Writing 502 – 40 points below the national average; SAT Mathematics 489 – 43 points below the national average).

AP Mentoring, 2021-22 School Year

AP Government and Politics and AP U.S. History teachers from each LEA. AP Mentoring is a teacher-toteacher support program from the College Board for teachers in these disciplines of all experience levels,
which connects teachers interested in enhancing their practice with mentor teachers who have deep
knowledge of AP and a record of student success.

Pre-AP Program, 2021-22 School Year:

 Pre-AP courses deliver grade-level appropriate instruction through focused course frameworks, engaging instructional resources, and learning checkpoints. Available to target districts who self-select to offer to 9th and 10th graders.

AP Best Practice Series for Teachers, Oct., Feb., and April 2021:

North Carolina Legislative Report

I The International Baccalaureate.

The International Baccalaureate offers four Programmes for schools and students; the Primary Years (PYP), pre-k through grade 5, Middle Years (MYP), grades 6 through 10, Diploma and Career-related (grades 11 and 12). The IB Organization's international education has a core goal to guide students towards the skills needed to be lifelong learners.

All 4 IB Programmes offer a student centered, inquiry-based approach to an international education, focused on approaches to learning for all age groups. These approaches include; research, communications, social, self-management and thinking skills. The skills needed to be lifelong learners. Through these skills, and the knowledge base that backs them, students become confident in their ability and prepared for success in whatever path they follow whether college or career.

During the 2020 – 2021 school year due to COVID, IB schools and students in 150 countries around the world, including the US, faced continued and significant disruption to their usual routines. IB programmes are based upon collaboration, teamwork. discussion and participation. Teachers had to adapt, innovate and learn new methods to help students continue their education and meet the IB's learning objectives. It is impressive how successful many school communities were in making this huge shift.

As in the latter part of the 2019 – 2020 school year the IBO modified its assessment practices to in order to provide valid and reliable marks while recognizing the challenges that students have faced. There were two major changes,

- o adaptations were made to the coursework and assessments, with mitigation introduced
- schools were given the opportunity to chose whether the final student scores would be determined;
 - as was done for the 2019 2020 year (calculated on the basis of the required internal assessments)
 - or by students in school writing the final examinations in a safe and secure setting

In <u>North Carolina</u> approximately **50%** of the schools chose the calculated route. The other half provided an in-school examination session.

The same assessment practices and options will be in place for the 2022 assessment session.

In 2023 the IB will return to completing the full suite of assessments both internal and external in a school setting.

The staff in all divisions of the IBO have been immensely impressed with the patience, adaptability and creativity shown by teachers and students during this stressful time.



I Schools and Growth


IB Authorized Public Schools and programmes in North Carolina

Schools and students in North Carolina have been participating in International Baccalaureate programmes since the first school was authorized in Charlotte-Mecklenburg in 1992. **64** schools in North Carolina currently offer the IBO's Programmes. A number of these schools are in partnership with a Middle school offering the MYP. There are; **20** PYP, **19** MYP, **30** DP and **7** CP programmes amongst these schools.

Current Candidate Schools and programmes in North Carolina (as of Sept 29, 2021)

There are **8** schools with programmes in candidacy, working towards authorization. **6** of these will be offering the Middle Years Programme, **1** for the Diploma and **1** for the Primary Years. Our research shows that students with Middle Years and/or Primary Years experience are more likely to join the Diploma Programme and will be more successful in it.

I Number of North Carolina candidates by Programme




It is interesting to note the growth in the number of schools now authorized for the Middle Years Programme. Our research shows that students who have participated in this programme are more likely to enrol in the Diploma programme in their junior and senior year and to be more successful in that two year programme that follows the middle years. II Students and Data from the Diploma and Career- related Programme

Number of test takers: Total = **2525**

- **2371** students from the Diploma Programme
 - 1009 of these students were attempting the *full diploma.
 The other 1362 were taking one or more diploma courses
- 154 students from the Career- related Programme

Total exams written: **8063** - 79% of these exams scoring 4 or better (see below)

For students attempting the full Diploma the pass rate was 68%. There were;

- *671 Diplomas awarded
- 9 Bilingual Diplomas awarded

*Achieving an IB Diploma is a very significant milestone. Students have completed two years of study in 6 courses one from each of the core academic areas; Literature and Language, a Second Language, Individuals and Societies (History), Mathematics, Science and either a second course from the above list or an Arts course. They have also completed a course called Theory of Knowledge which considers ways of knowing and looks at the interdisciplinary connections between their courses. Diploma students must also do community service and extracurricular activity as well as prepare and submit a formal research paper of 4000 words on a topic in a subject area of interest to them. III A summary of Performance data for students in 2021 the IB Diploma and Career-related programmes includes;

- There were in total, **9332** examinations written by students in these programmes. The IB exams are rigorous and measure competencies in many learning skills, as well as in subject knowledge in significant depth.
- Final scores of **4 or better** were achieved on **79%** of these exams. The final score is the result of the combination of the results achieved on required assessments during the 2 years of the courses and the results on the final exam. The IB scale is 1 through 7. This score is an important milestone for recognition, as you will see below.
- **909** North Carolina students requested transcripts of their IB success be sent to North Carolina universities they plan to attend.

IV Post-Secondary Recognition.

 Participation in IB coursework is an important contributor to admissions decisions at North Carolina Public and Private Universities and at Universities throughout the US, Canada and around the world.



 A score of 4 or better on IB coursework often leads to credit and placement options at many universities in the US including both private and public institutions in North Carolina. Details can be found on the institution websites.

V Support for students, teachers and schools

The IBO's goal is to provide students an opportunity to learn and develop skills in a setting where they are engaged by teachers using the most up to date pedagogical practices. We want all students to be able to participate successfully in their learning.

During this challenging year, both the IB Professional Development and Learning and Teaching divisions began creating resources for teachers and administrators to draw upon for guidance and support. That material was made available through free online learning resources and some detailed support material on the Programme Resource Centre available to teachers in authorized and candidate schools. This year all of our professional development and authorization activities have been completed virtually.

- Authorization of Schools.
 - We provide consultants and guidance during the 2 to 3-year process to help schools be successful in becoming an IB authorized school. and we participate with each authorized school every five years to help them review and improve their programme. These processes are all being done virtually at this time.
- Required Professional Development for teachers and administrators
 - Exceptional workshops help school leaders and teachers learn how to guide students to become the learners we envision. In the 2020 2021 school year 319 North Carolina teachers, coordinators and administrators participated in our online Professional Development workshops. Another 230 NC teachers have completed; In-School Workshops, District Workshops and other IB Professional Development opportunities. It is noteworthy that in this demanding and challenging year so many educators have found the time to build their professional skills and knowledge.
 - The IBO has developed several resources available free of charge to educators to help with adaptation to teaching virtually. They include;
 - COVID leadership; self paced online workshops for school leaders
 - Specific Learning resources for each programme
 - A webinar for virtual learning
- Programme Resource Centre
 - Teachers and coordinators have access to a globally subscribed Programme Resource Centre. The PRC contains proven resource material to help teachers and coordinators to be successful. From Sept 2020 through Sept, 2021 there were 4988 user visits to the PRC from teacher and coordinators in North Carolina. This number is a significant increase over last year.



A great deal of support material from the IB's Teaching and Learning Division was added this year. Much of it was developed specifically for teachers working virtually with IB students in all IB programmes. North Carolina teachers have been making good use of this material to provide the best possible education for their students.

IBO Staff support

There are specific IBO staff for NC schools assigned to authorized and candidate schools who help with the process of becoming an authorized IB school and with the work that continues towards improvement once authorized. Each authorized school in North Carolina is assigned an IB World School Manager to whom they can reach out for support as needed.

VI Research

Summarized below are three examples of interesting, very recent research about the success of students in IB programmes.

I

For the DP/CP, a study on global-mindedness. Here are a few main findings below.

This study measured DP and CP students' global-mindedness levels benchmarked against their peers from a similar age range and the same six countries (Australia, Germany, Japan, Mexico, Spain and the **United States**). To examine levels of global mindedness, researchers used the World Values Survey (WVS). Here are some of the study's main findings:

- Across all of the countries studied, DP and CP students showed higher levels of global mindedness than young adults in the WVS benchmark groups. The difference was statistically significant in five out of six countries, including the US.
- Additionally, second-year IB students averaged higher global-mindedness levels than their first-year peers in five out of the six countries, suggesting that exposure to the DP and CP may increase levels of global mindedness.





A study on <u>critical thinking among DP students</u> This study examined the effects of the DP on the critical thinking skills of students in Australia, England and Norway. Here are some of the study's main findings:

- The results suggest that the IB embraces an approach to critical thinking development, which is largely in line with best practice research.
- Quantitative findings indicated that IB students had significantly higher levels of critical thinking than their non-IB peers—an advantage that held even after matched samples of IB and non-IB students were used for comparison.
- The critical thinking advantage of IB students also increased over the course of the DP.
- In interviews, students and teachers shared a belief that the theory of knowledge course, the extended essay and DP subjects foster critical thinking development. Teachers and students also generally believed that the DP better prepares students for university compared to national or state programmes.

Ш

A study on <u>PYP and MYP outcomes on the International Schools Assessment</u>. See a description and some main findings below.

This study examined PYP and MYP student performance on the International Schools' Assessment (ISA) compared with non-IB students from the same ISA cohorts. The study also investigated how grade 9 and 10 MYP students' ISA results compared with PISA means.



Here are some of the study's main findings:

- Consistent with previous research (Tan, Bibby 2010; Tan, Bibby 2012), analysis showed that, on a global level, PYP and MYP students performed significantly better than students from non-IB schools in the ISA assessment areas at several grade levels. In fact, IB students performed as well or better in all the domain and grade comparisons.
- When comparing MYP students' ISA scores with the PISA benchmarks, MYP students
 had statistically higher mean scores in all three domains (Mathematical literacy, Reading
 and Scientific literacy), similar to the findings of the previous two studies (Tan, Bibby
 2010; Tan, Bibby 2012).


