

STATE CONTRACTUAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND  
SUMMARY ANNUAL REPORT TO THE JOINT LEGISLATIVE  
EDUCATION OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE

The North Carolina State Education Assistance Authority (NCSEAA) submits the 2000-2001 State Contractual Scholarship Fund (SCSF) Summary Annual Report to the Joint Legislative Education Oversight Committee. This report describes the awarding of the SCSF to full-time equivalent (FTE) needy North Carolina undergraduate students enrolled in off-campus programs at private colleges and universities. These funds were awarded by each institution to eligible students pursuant to G.S. 116-19.

**BACKGROUND**

The SCSF was created by the 1971 General Assembly of North Carolina to provide financial assistance to resident students attending eligible private colleges and universities located in North Carolina. The NCSEAA has administered this program since July of 1993.

The NCSEAA negotiates an agreement with each of the private, non-profit junior and senior colleges and universities in the state. Under this agreement, each institution promises to administer a scholarship fund for needy undergraduates who are North Carolina residents. The annual appropriation is allocated among schools in proportion to the ratio that each school occupies to the total North Carolina undergraduates enrollment in all eligible schools as of October 1 of each year.

Table 78 (attached) reports the total FTE enrollment as of October 1, 2000 is 28,555 at the eligible private colleges and universities in North Carolina. The General Assembly appropriated \$31,763,002 to be divided among the needy students enrolled at each campus during the academic year. To verify that adequate funding is available to award each institution, the number of FTE students as of October 1 is multiplied by \$1,100 ( $28,555 \times \$1,100 = \$31,410,500$ ). This year the appropriation was sufficient to fully fund 12,750 needy students with SCSF awards at all private institutions.

### **PRIVATE COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES WITH OFF-CAMPUS SITES**

At the direction of the Joint Legislative Education Oversight Committee, we have prepared a report covering the twelve North Carolina private colleges and universities that currently administer off-campus degree programs. An off-campus site is defined as "a site located in North Carolina away from the main, permanent campus of the institution."

For 2000-2001, the twelve private institutions with off-campus instructional sites received a combined SCSF appropriation of \$15,376,625.00 (48.95% of the SCSF appropriation awarded to all private colleges and universities for the same period). The attached SCSF 2000-2001 Off-Campus By Site Disbursement Chart shows that as of August 1, 2001 these schools were awarded 1,891 SCSF scholarships totaling \$1,707,803.07. Students who received SCSF awards at off-campus sites constituted 14.8% of the 12,750 students awarded at all private institutions and 29.1% of 6,509 students awarded at the 12 institutions with off-campus programs. These students received 5.44% of the total SCSF monies (\$31,410,500) awarded at all of the private colleges and universities during 2000-2001 and 11.1% of the monies awarded at the institutions offering off-campus instruction.

In evaluating the attached SCSF 2000-2001 Off-Campus By Site Disbursement Chart, a number of factors should be considered:

(1) Several institutions reported that the cost of attendance for students enrolled at their off-campus sites was lower, since those students usually live at home and no room and board costs are associated with their billing.

(2) Seven of the 12 schools included in this report offer reduced tuition rates to students enrolled at their off-campus sites, making an education at the off-site locations more affordable. These schools are: Campbell, Gardner-Webb, High Point, Mars Hill, Mount Olive, North Carolina Wesleyan, and St. Andrews.

(3) Military tuition assistance is available to military personnel who enroll at off-campus programs offered by Campbell, Mount Olive and North Carolina Wesleyan, and those students who qualify may also receive the North Carolina Legislative Tuition Grant, if they enroll in at least 12 semester hours of instruction. Military tuition assistance alone does not meet the financial need of most military personnel.

(4) Campbell University, High Point University, and Mars Hill College reported that the majority of their adult students did not file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and, therefore, these students would not qualify for need-based aid.

(5) Most of the off-campus programs at the institutions involved in this survey are held at night. The majority of the students enrolled in such programs are independent, continuing education students who have full-time day jobs. The Expected Family Contribution of such students, determined by a federal formula when the FAFSA is filed, will usually be larger than that of a traditional dependent student.

NOTE: The allocations shown above were made under the State Contractual Scholarship Fund (SCSF) program to North Carolina resident undergraduate students attending private colleges and universities in North Carolina. For 2000-01, the allocation made to each institution was determined by multiplying the number of full-time equivalent North Carolina resident undergraduates enrolled by \$1,100.00. The funds so allocated were then granted by the institutions to their North Carolina undergraduate students on the basis of financial need. The General Assembly appropriated \$31,763,002 for the SCSF program for the 2000-01 academic year. The North Carolina State Education Assistance Authority has administered the SCSF program since July 1993.
