## EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

### ***More at Four* Pre-Kindergarten Program Progress Report to the General Assembly May 1, 2004**

The *More at Four* Pre-Kindergarten Program is North Carolina's statewide educational pre-kindergarten program for at-risk four-year-olds. The program aims to improve academic performance and help eliminate the achievement gap for young children who would otherwise start school significantly behind their peers. Pre-kindergarten classrooms must meet the highest quality standards that are proven effective in promoting school readiness.

The *More at Four* Pre-Kindergarten Program is in its third year. This report provides information about *More at Four's* implementation for SFY 2003-04, as of April 20. Key points from the report include:

- The program has served 10,999 children, as of April 20, 2004.
- *More at Four* is serving children with risk factors that place them in jeopardy of low academic achievement. Family income is the leading risk factor. Ninety percent of children served are in families with incomes low enough to qualify for free and reduced price lunch in schools.
- *More at Four* is reaching children who are not being served by other programs. Eighty-three percent of children served were unserved when enrolled in *More at Four*.
- *More at Four* is now serving children in all 100 counties in North Carolina.
- *More at Four* builds on the state's existing early care and education system: 44 percent of children are served in public schools, 44 percent in licensed child care centers and 10 percent in Head Start.
- Local *More at Four* programs strive to meet *More at Four's* high quality education, credentialing and licensure standards for teachers, teacher assistants, and administrators. While many staff meet the standards, this remains one of the most significant challenges facing local programs. The state office supports local programs by providing funding for T.E.A.C.H. Early Childhood® scholarships for teachers to further their education and by providing targeted professional development opportunities for staff throughout the year.
- Ninety one percent of *More at Four's* budgeted \$43.1 million in state funds are for classroom operations. *More at Four* state funds also support professional development and T.E.A.C.H. Early Childhood® scholarships for teachers, an external evaluation, and database development.

- Over \$29 million in other resources accessed at the local level supporting the program are anticipated for SFY 2003-04. Other resources accessed include Smart Start, Pre-School Disabilities, Subsidy, Head Start, Title I, Other LEA funds, and City/County Appropriations.
- Local *More at Four* programs use a variety of child find strategies successfully to find and recruit at-risk four-year-olds, including coordination with public school pre-kindergarten recruitment, coordination with other agencies in the community serving families with young children, advertising through the local media, posting flyers in key locations in the community and using strategies designed to reach out to Hispanic/Latino families. Child find typically was not a barrier to effective implementation of *More at Four* – in fact, most counties found more unserved at-risk four-year-olds than they had the capacity to serve.

## **I. Overview of the *More at Four* Pre-Kindergarten Program**

### ***More at Four* is preparing North Carolina's at-risk four-year-olds for success in school**

The *More at Four* Pre-Kindergarten Program is North Carolina's educational pre-kindergarten program to ensure that at-risk four-year-olds start school with the necessary skills for success. The program focuses first on reaching those four-year-olds who are at risk of school failure due to poverty and other risk factors and who are not served by any other early education program. *More at Four* addresses a gap in the availability of high quality pre-kindergarten for preschool children who would most benefit from an early education opportunity, but do not have access to a quality program.

### ***More at Four* is serving at-risk preschool children for its third year**

The *More at Four* Pre-Kindergarten Program began in 2001-02 with an appropriation of \$6.5 million to serve approximately 1,600 children. Funding was awarded competitively to 34 counties across the state to implement *More at Four* pre-kindergarten classrooms.

In 2002-03, the program expanded statewide to serve 7,600 four-year-olds in the second year, with a total appropriation of \$34.5 million. Funding to implement *More at Four* was available to every county that chose to participate and an additional 56 counties began providing *More at Four* programs, bringing total participation to 90 counties.

In 2003-04, *More at Four* was expanded to serve 10,000 at-risk four-year-olds statewide, with a total appropriation of \$43.1 million. All 100 counties are participating in *More at Four* this year.

### ***More at Four* is helping close the achievement gap**

We know that children facing the disadvantages of poverty in their preschool years have less exposure to the basic language and math skills necessary for success in kindergarten. Children who start kindergarten behind their classmates may never catch up. Compelling research demonstrates that pre-kindergarten programs like *More at Four* are successful in preparing at-risk young children for school.

Several studies of other programs have followed children over many years, finding not only short-term academic benefits of pre-kindergarten, but also major long-term academic and social benefits, such as higher academic achievement, more years of educational attainment, lower high school drop-out rates, and lower arrest rates. A plan is in place to evaluate the current and long-term success of *More at Four*. Preliminary child pre-post assessments for SFY 2002-03 on a sample of children were reported in the January 2004 legislative report, showing significant gains in eight of nine measures during the pre-kindergarten year.

### ***More at Four* classrooms meet the highest quality standards**

*More at Four* pre-kindergarten classrooms meet the highest quality standards that have been proven effective in promoting school readiness. Class sizes are small – no more than 18 children per class, with a teacher and teacher assistant. Teachers must be licensed in early childhood education. Programs must use a research-based curriculum and five curricula have been recommended by a committee of curriculum experts. Families are involved in their children's education.

The *More at Four* classroom presents academic content in a developmentally appropriate context. Students in a *More at Four* classroom learn through child-initiated and teacher-initiated activities. Through these activities, children accomplish the work of learning language, math, science, and social skills. Such skills include counting, recognizing some alphabet letters, understanding the world around them, how and why we use books, and the broad range of skills that make future learning possible. Like all high quality programs, *More at Four* classrooms are responsive to cultural diversity and the needs of individual children.

### ***More at Four* fosters coordination and collaboration within North Carolina's early care and education system**

Communities implement *More at Four* pre-kindergarten classrooms in a variety of settings, including licensed child care centers, public schools, and Head Start programs, according to locally determined needs and resources. At the state and local levels, *More at Four* works closely with Smart Start, the public schools, Head Start, licensed child care providers, the Division of Child Development, the early intervention system and other relevant programs to create a coordinated system of early care and education services for North Carolina's young children.

Building on each community's existing early care and education delivery system, *More at Four* programs are implemented by coordinating with local programs. Local communities develop collaborative plans for implementing *More at Four* classrooms, with shared leadership from Smart Start and the public schools and broad representation from early childhood service providers.

## II. ***More at Four* Pre-Kindergarten Program Implementation, SFY 2003-04**

### **A. Children Served**

***More at Four* has served 10,999 children in SFY 2003-04, as of April 20.**

In SFY 2003-04, the original 7,623 slots were available through the continuation budget and an additional 2,400 slots were approved for expansion of the program, making a total of 10,023 slots authorized for allocation statewide. At least 10,999 children have been served in those slots as of April 20, 2004. *(NOTE: This figure is not the final number of children served for SFY 2003-04 since the county child enrollment reports for the April, May and June service months are still remaining. Final county enrollment data and payment requests are due June 20, 2004.)*

The program is serving at least 4,728 more children this year than last. The program served 6,271 children in SFY 2002-03.

Children served by *More at Four* have risk factors that place them in jeopardy of school failure. Family income is the leading risk factor. Ninety percent of children served in *More at Four* programs to date in SFY 2003-04 qualified for either free (75 percent) or reduced (15 percent) price lunch.

Among the at-risk four-year-olds identified, those who have never been served in any preschool or child care setting or are currently unserved have first priority for *More at Four* services, followed by those currently underserved.

Among the children served in SFY 2003-04, as of April 20:

- 83 percent were unserved when enrolled in *More at Four*
- 62 percent had never been served in any preschool or child care setting

### **B. County Participation**

**All 100 counties in North Carolina are now participating in *More at Four*.**

In SFY 2003-04, all 100 counties have chosen to participate in the *More at Four* Pre-Kindergarten Program. Ninety counties participated in 2002-03 and 34 participated in 2001-02. See Appendix A for more information on counties participating by contractor and slots. Also see Appendix C for a list of *More at Four* sites by county/region and the number of children served at each site.

## C. Types of Service Delivery Settings

***More at Four* providers are serving children within a variety of educational settings.**

Table 1 provides the number and percent of sites and children served by type of site. Forty-four percent of children are served in both public schools and licensed child care centers, with 10 percent served in Head Start. This distribution varies across counties, but it shows how *More at Four* is building on the existing early childhood education service delivery system statewide.

## D. Staff Credentials

**Local *More at Four* sites strive to meet *More at Four's* high quality education, credentialing and licensure standards for teachers, teacher assistants and administrators.**

Teachers: It is the standard that *More at Four* pre-kindergarten classrooms will be staffed by a teacher with the NC Birth – Kindergarten (B-K) or Preschool Add-on licensure within four years of the establishment of the classroom. A growing body of research links teachers with four year degrees and specialized knowledge in early childhood education with better child outcomes.



Many teachers meet the standard. A large number of teachers, however, still need to work toward meeting the standard by furthering their education in early childhood education.

For the 2003-04 school year, out of 874 *More at Four* teachers:

- 22.6 percent hold B-K or Preschool Add-on licenses;
- 36.9 percent hold another type of North Carolina teaching license; and
- 86 percent have earned bachelor degrees or higher.

In addition:

- 22.9 percent of teachers are working toward their B-K or Preschool Add-on licenses.

Teacher Assistants: The standard for teacher assistants is the Child Development Associate (CDA) credential, while an associate degree in early childhood education/child development is strongly encouraged. Many teacher assistants still need assistance to meet the required credential for *More at Four*.

For the 2003-04 school year, out of 768 teacher assistants:

- 36.6 percent hold an associate degree or higher (in any field), while 30 percent are working toward it;
- of the teacher assistants with less than an associate degree, 9.7 percent hold the CDA, and 6.2 percent are working toward it; and
- approximately 25 percent have a high school degree and do not hold a CDA.

There is an exception for public school teacher assistants who may have a high school degree but meet the No Child Left Behind federal legislation requirements. These data are currently not available, but will be collected in future years.

Principals/Directors: *More at Four* and public school systems require principal licensure for public school sites. Fifty-two percent of the 572 administrators (principals) for SFY 2003-04 hold this license, which is consistent with the approximate percentage of *More at Four* sites that are public schools.

For child care centers, the *More at Four* standard is the N.C. Early Childhood Administration Credential (NCECAC) Level II, working toward Level III. For the remaining 47 percent of administrators who are child care center directors, the following credentials were reported:

- 52.8 percent hold a NCECAC Level III or are working toward it;
- 23.0 percent hold the NCECAC Level II; and
- 24.2 percent hold less than a Level II or indicate "Other" credentials.

## E. Budget Data

Table 2 provides the budget for *More at Four* state funds for SFY 2003-04. Actual expenditures will not be available until after the end of the 2003-04 state fiscal year.

Table 3 provides the projected amount of other resources accessed to support the *More at Four* program in SFY 2003-04. The amount of other resources accessed at the local level anticipated to date for this year is \$29,253,580. See Appendix B for the types of other resources accessed to support *More at Four* by contractor. Final reports from contractors on other resources accessed for SFY 2003-04 are due June 20, 2004.

The total budget supporting *More at Four* for SFY 2003-04 is \$ 72,377,022, including state funds and other resources accessed. Other resources accessed at the local level represent 44.8 percent of the classroom operating funding (not including one-time start-up funds).

As of April 20, 2004, all but \$372,476 of the \$37,162,685 state operational budget has been obligated or is under contract. Additionally, all but \$5,000 of the \$2,200,000 of the start-up budget has been obligated or is under contract. Projected expenditures for the remaining fiscal year are tentative as of this report, as the predominant percentage of funding expended will be determined by local contract expenditures.

Table 4 provides state funds and slots under contract and the statewide average per slot for the SFY 2003-04, as of April 20.

*\* Current legislation requires that any unspent and unencumbered funds will be transferred to the DHHS Division of Child Development (DCD) at the end of the fiscal year for distribution to subsidy. Earlier in the year, \$800,000 was transferred to DCD for this purpose.*

A comprehensive cost analysis of the program for SFY 2003-04, including the cost per child served by the program, as required in the *More at Four* legislation, is not feasible until all expenditures are final at the end of the state fiscal year.

### **III. *More at Four* Pre-Kindergarten Program Support, SFY 2003-04**

#### **A. Child Find Activities**

**Local *More at Four* Pre-Kindergarten programs use a variety of strategies successfully to find and recruit at-risk four-year-olds.**

For SFY 2003-04, *More at Four* contractors were asked to report to the state office the “top 2 or 3 most effective strategies” used to find and recruit children to their local programs. The response rate was 65 percent out of 91 contractors receiving the survey. Of the contractors responding, the most common strategies reported include:

- Coordinating *More at Four* pre-kindergarten recruitment/registration with recruitment/registration for other preschool programs, especially public school pre-kindergarten. Many counties use a single, county-wide recruitment and registration process for all pre-kindergarten programs. Head Start may be included, as well. Many areas also coordinate pre-kindergarten registration with kindergarten registration. Using Title I waiting lists is also a strategy in some communities.
- Providing information about *More at Four* pre-kindergarten through the public schools. In particular, many communities send information home to families with children in the elementary schools.
- Coordinating with other service agencies in the community, especially Departments of Social Services, Health Departments, Mental Health agencies, local Partnerships for Children, Head Start, Child Care Resource and Referral agencies, and Parents as Teachers programs. Strategies include providing information and flyers to other community service agencies and getting referrals from other agencies. Communities are also using child care subsidy waiting lists, as well as Head Start waiting lists or children ineligible for Head Start.
- Posting flyers throughout the community. Many communities post flyers in public places, businesses, community service agencies and doctors’ offices. Some communities provide information to local churches and faith community leaders.
- Using local media. Providing information through local newspapers was the most common media strategy, but some communities also use radio and television announcements.
- Using specific strategies for Hispanic/Latino families. These strategies include flyers in Spanish, coordinating with community agencies that serve Hispanic families, and using migrant recruiters.

- Many contractors also noted that word of mouth and the reputation of the *More at Four* program brings families to them.
- Approximately 88 percent of contractors responding to the survey indicated that they join with other child find activities or organizations in the recruitment process.

According to survey responses, child find was typically not a challenge for providers in SFY 2003-04. At least 63 percent of contractors responding, in fact, said they have found more unserved children than they are able to serve.

## **B. Teacher Education, Training and Support**

**Attaining the teacher licensure and education standards remains one of the most significant challenges facing local *More at Four* Pre-Kindergarten programs. A collaboration between *More at Four* and the T.E.A.C.H. Early Childhood® Project supports local programs and teachers in meeting the standards by providing teacher scholarships.**

The T.E.A.C.H. Early Childhood® Project / *More at Four* collaboration helps teachers work toward their professional development goals and comply with the *More at Four* teacher education standards. In SFY 2003-04, this collaboration provided 135 scholarships to teachers working in *More at Four* pre-kindergarten classrooms in 39 counties. Of the 135 scholarship recipients, 84 were awarded an Associate Degree Scholarship, 27 were awarded a Bachelor Degree Scholarship, 23 were awarded a Birth-Kindergarten (B-K) Licensure Scholarship, and one was awarded a Preschool Add-on Licensure Scholarship. In addition, 27 scholarships were awarded to college and university students preparing to work in a *More at Four* pre-kindergarten classroom. These students attended 10 colleges and universities in North Carolina.

Programs with teachers who are active participants in the T.E.A.C.H. Early Childhood® Associate Degree, Bachelor Degree or B-K Licensure Scholarship programs are also eligible to receive assistance with health insurance costs for teachers and administrative staff. The T.E.A.C.H. Early Childhood® Health Insurance Program reimburses centers one-third of the cost of an individual premium (up to \$70) for each teaching and administrative staff who are on the center's health insurance bill. Participating centers that also have a *More at Four* classroom can have two-thirds (up to \$140) reimbursed for each of the *More at Four* teachers who appear on the center's health insurance bill. This year, *More at Four* has supported health insurance for 90 teachers in 47 different centers in 25 counties, with an additional seven centers currently under review for participation.

**The *More at Four* state office further supports teachers by providing targeted professional development opportunities throughout the year.**

Over 550 *More at Four* teachers and administrators attended the *More at Four* Summer Institute in July 2003. This two-day institute provided topics related to effective implementation of *More at Four* and best practices in the early childhood classroom.

Over 125 teachers attended one-day training on the appropriate use of computers in the early childhood classroom in January and February 2004. Topics related to the selection of software appropriate for pre-kindergarten children and the effective use of computers in the pre-kindergarten classroom.

Over 1100 teachers, teacher assistants and administrators participated in the one-day professional development session titled "What High Quality Pre-Kindergarten Looks Like" in February through April 2004. This session covered implementing an effective, appropriate pre-kindergarten program. Particular emphasis was placed on intentionality in curriculum planning and implementation, literacy instruction, mathematical thinking, and high quality environments.

## IV. Summary

The *More at Four* Pre-Kindergarten Program is North Carolina's statewide educational pre-kindergarten program for at-risk four-year-olds. The program aims to help eliminate the achievement gap by preparing four-year-olds for success in kindergarten – four-year-olds who would otherwise start school significantly behind their more advantaged peers.

In SFY 2003-4, *More at Four's* third year of implementation, the program is meeting the following goals:

- Serving over 10,000 at-risk four-year-olds;
- Serving children in all 100 counties;
- Serving children with risk factors for low educational attainment, particularly low-income children. Ninety percent of children served are in families with incomes low enough to qualify for free or reduced lunch in schools;
- Serving children in diverse educational settings, including public schools, licensed child care centers and Head Start;
- Serving children who would be unserved without this program. Eighty-three percent of children served were unserved when enrolled in *More at Four*, and
- Promoting high quality learning environments. *More at Four's* pre-kindergarten teachers, for example, are required to be licensed in early childhood education and *More at Four* is supporting teachers across the state who are working toward that goal.

As the *More at Four* Pre-Kindergarten Program plans for the future of pre-kindergarten education in North Carolina, it is working with key partners to study the expansion of high quality pre-kindergarten opportunities for North Carolina's four-year-olds. A team of the *More at Four* Pre-Kindergarten Program Task Force members – representing the N.C. Department of Health and Human Services, the N.C. Department of Public Instruction, the N.C. Partnership for Children, the *More at Four* Pre-Kindergarten Program, and early childhood education experts – are exploring ways to expand the standards applicable to *More at Four* pre-kindergarten classrooms across a variety of settings. This team is comparing standards for various current programs for four-year-olds (e.g., licensed child care, Head Start Programs, public school pre-kindergarten programs) and studying the barriers to implementing higher pre-kindergarten standards in each setting. Without additional funding, expanding *More at Four* standards across settings will be a voluntary process, perhaps resulting in special recognition of higher quality through existing mechanisms. This study will continue into the 2004-05 fiscal year.
