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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

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The *More at Four* Pre-Kindergarten Program is North Carolina's educational pre-kindergarten program to ensure that at-risk four-year-olds start school with the necessary skills for success. The program focuses first on reaching those four-year-olds who are at risk of school failure due to poverty and other risk factors and who are not served by any other early education program. *More at Four* addresses a gap in the availability of high quality pre-kindergarten for preschool children who would most benefit from an early education opportunity, but do not have access to a quality program. Pre-kindergarten classrooms meet the highest quality standards that are proven effective in promoting school readiness.

The *More at Four* Pre-Kindergarten Program is in its fourth year. This progress report to the General Assembly provides information about *More at Four*'s implementation for SFY 2003-04 and SFY 2004-05. The data for SFY 2003-04 are final. The data for SFY 2004-05 are preliminary, as of December 23, 2004.

Key points from the report include:

- The program served 11,208 children in SFY 2003-04. The program has served 12,806 children to date in SFY 2004-05.
- *More at Four* is serving children with risk factors that place them in jeopardy of low academic achievement. Family income is the leading risk factor. This year, 90 percent of children served to date are in families with incomes low enough to qualify for free or reduced price lunch in schools.
- *More at Four* is reaching children who are not being served by other programs. This year, 79 percent of children served to date were unserved when enrolled in *More at Four*.
- *More at Four* builds on the state's existing early care and education system: this year, 49 percent of children served to date are served in public schools, 42 percent in licensed child care centers, and nine percent in Head Start.
- Over 91 percent of *More at Four*'s approximately \$51 million in state funds budgeted for SFY 2004-05 are for classroom operations. *More at Four* state funds also support professional development, T.E.A.C.H. Early Childhood® scholarships for teachers, and an external evaluation.
- Approximately \$30.6 million in other resources accessed at the local level are projected for SFY 2004-05, as reported by the *More at Four* local contractors. Other resources accessed include Smart Start, Pre-School Disabilities, Subsidy, Head Start, Title I, City/County Appropriations and other.



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I. Overview of the *More at Four* Pre-Kindergarten Program

***More at Four* is preparing North Carolina's at-risk four-year-olds for success in school**

The *More at Four* Pre-Kindergarten Program is North Carolina's educational pre-kindergarten program to ensure that at-risk four-year-olds start school with the necessary skills for success. The program focuses first on reaching those four-year-olds who are at risk of school failure due to poverty and other risk factors and who are not served by any other early education program. *More at Four* addresses a gap in the availability of high quality pre-kindergarten for preschool children who would most benefit from an early education opportunity, but do not have access to a quality program.

***More at Four* is serving at-risk preschool children for its fourth year**

The *More at Four* Pre-Kindergarten Program began in 2001-02 with an appropriation of \$6.5 million to serve approximately 1,600 children in selected counties. In 2002-03, the program expanded statewide to serve 7,600 children with a total appropriation of \$34.5 million. Funding to implement *More at Four* was available to every county that chose to participate and 90 counties participated. In 2003-04, *More at Four* expanded to serve 10,000 at-risk four-year-olds statewide, with a total appropriation of \$43.1 million, in all 100 counties.

In 2004-05, *More at Four* is serving over 12,000 four-year-olds statewide with an appropriation of \$51.1 million.

***More at Four* is improving educational achievement and contributing to the state's economic development**

Children facing the disadvantages of poverty in their preschool years have less exposure to the basic language and math skills necessary for success in kindergarten. Children who start kindergarten behind their classmates may never catch up. Compelling research demonstrates that pre-kindergarten programs like *More at Four* are successful in preparing at-risk young children for school. Several studies of other programs have followed children over many years, finding not only short-term academic benefits of pre-kindergarten, but also major long-term academic and social benefits, such as higher academic achievement, more years of educational attainment, lower high school drop-out rates, and lower arrest rates.

Research analyses by prominent economists assert that pre-kindergarten programs are compelling from an economic and societal perspective. They reduce crime, enhance productivity, and provide high societal return on investment for dollars expended, even 40 years after pre-kindergarten is provided.

A plan is in place to evaluate the current and long-term success of *More at Four*. In 2002-03, a randomly selected sample of children demonstrated substantial growth in skills related to kindergarten readiness over the *More at Four* program year. Significant improvements were found in language and literacy skills (receptive language, alphabet knowledge, phonological awareness, story and print concepts); math skills (counting); general knowledge (social awareness and color naming); and behavioral skills (social skills.)

More at Four classrooms meet the highest quality standards

More at Four pre-kindergarten classrooms meet the highest quality standards that have been proven effective in promoting school readiness. Class sizes are small – no more than 18 children per class, with a teacher and teacher assistant. Teachers must be licensed in early childhood education within a designated timeframe and use a research-based, comprehensive curriculum. Programs must hold a 4- or 5-star rating according to child care licensing standards, while 3-star programs may participate while upgrading to at least a 4-star rating within a designated timeframe. Families are involved in their children's education.

The *More at Four* classroom presents academic content in a developmentally appropriate context. Students in a *More at Four* classroom learn through child-initiated and teacher-initiated activities. Through these activities, children accomplish the work of learning language, math, science, and social skills. Such skills include counting, recognizing some alphabet letters, understanding the world around them, how and why we use books, and the broad range of skills that make future learning possible. Like all high quality programs, *More at Four* classrooms are responsive to cultural diversity and the needs of individual children.

More at Four fosters coordination within our state's early care and education system

Local communities implement *More at Four* pre-kindergarten classrooms in a variety of settings, including licensed for-profit and nonprofit child care centers, public schools, and Head Start programs, according to locally determined needs and resources. Communities develop collaborative plans for implementing *More at Four* classrooms, with shared leadership from Smart Start and the public schools and broad representation from early childhood service providers. At the state and local levels, *More at Four* works closely with Smart Start, the public schools, Head Start, licensed child care providers, the Division of Child Development, the early intervention system and other relevant programs to create a coordinated system of early care and education services for North Carolina's young children.

II. *More at Four* Pre-Kindergarten Program Implementation

A. Children Served

In SFY 2003-04, 10,023 slots were authorized for allocation statewide and a total of 11,208 children were served.

In SFY 2004-05, 12,174 slots have been authorized for allocation and, as of December 23, 2004, 12,806 children have been served.

***More at Four* Pre-K is reaching at-risk children.**

Children served by *More at Four* have risk factors that place them in jeopardy of school failure. Family income is the leading risk factor. In SFY 2003-04, 89.8 percent of children served in *More at Four* programs qualified for either free (74.9 percent) or reduced (14.9 percent) price lunch. In SFY 2004-05, 90.7 percent of children served in *More at Four* to date qualified for either free (76.0 percent) or reduced (14.7 percent) price lunch.

Among the at-risk four-year-olds identified, those who have never been served in any preschool or child care setting or are currently unserved have first priority for *More at Four* services, followed by those currently underserved. The goal of reaching unserved children is being met.

In SFY 2003-04:

- 61.8 percent had never been served in any preschool or child care setting, plus
- 21.3 percent were currently unserved when enrolled in *More at Four*

In SFY 2004-05, as of December 23, 2004:

- 60.8 percent had never been served in any preschool or child care setting, plus
- 17.8 percent were currently unserved when enrolled in *More at Four*

Other children were in lower quality settings that did not meet *More at Four* standards.

B. County Participation

All 100 counties in North Carolina participate in *More at Four*.

Beginning with SFY 2003-04, all 100 counties chose to participate in *More at Four*. See Appendix A for more information on county participation for SFY 2003-04 and Appendix B for SFY 2004-05, as of December 23, 2004. Also see Appendix C for a list of *More at Four* sites by county/region and the number of children served at each site for SFY 2004-05, as of December 23, 2004.

C. Types of Service Delivery Settings

More at Four providers are serving children within a variety of educational settings and building on the existing service delivery system.

Table 1 provides data on sites and children served by type of site for SFY 2003-04. Public schools and licensed child care centers each served 44 percent of the children, with 10 percent served in Head Start. This distribution varies across counties, but it shows how *More at Four* is building on the existing service delivery system statewide.

Table 2 provides data on sites and children served by type of site for SFY 2004-05, as of December 23, 2004. Percentages across types of settings are similar to SFY 2003-04. Forty-nine percent of children are served in public schools, 42 percent licensed child care centers, with 9 percent served in Head Start.

D. Staff Credentials

Local *More at Four* sites strive to meet *More at Four*'s high quality education, credentialing and licensure standards for teachers, teacher assistants and administrators.

Lead Teachers: It is the standard that *More at Four* pre-kindergarten classrooms will be staffed by a teacher with the NC Birth – Kindergarten (B-K) or Preschool Add-on licensure within four years of the establishment of the classroom as a *More at Four* classroom. A growing body of research links teachers with four year degrees and specialized knowledge in early childhood education with better child outcomes.

Many lead teachers meet the standard. A large number of lead teachers, however, still need to work toward meeting the standard by furthering their education in early childhood education.

For the 2003-04 school year, out of 892 *More at Four* lead teachers:

- 29.3 percent held B-K or Preschool Add-on licenses;
- 23.0 percent held a North Carolina teaching license; and
- 80.7 percent had earned bachelor degrees or higher.

In addition:

- 20.2 percent of lead teachers were working on credentials leading to their B-K or Preschool Add-on licenses.

For the 2004-05 school year, as of December 23, 2004, out of 1,019 *More at Four* lead teachers:

- 50.7 percent hold B-K or Preschool Add-on licenses;
- 9.5 percent hold a North Carolina teaching license; and
- 84.5 percent have earned bachelor degrees or higher.

In addition:

- 39.1 percent of lead teachers are working toward credentials that will ultimately lead to the B-K or Preschool Add-on license.

Teacher Assistants: The standard for teacher assistants is the Child Development Associate (CDA) credential, while an associate degree in early childhood education/child development is strongly encouraged. Many teacher assistants still need assistance to meet the required credential for *More at Four*.

For the 2003-04 school year, out of 775 teacher assistants:

- 39.4 percent hold an associate degree or higher (in any field), while 31.3 percent are working toward an associate degree;
- of the teacher assistants with less than an associate degree, 11.2 percent hold the CDA, and 4.1 percent are working toward it; and
- approximately 29.3 percent have a high school degree and do not hold a CDA.

For the 2004-05 school year, as of December 23, 2004, out of 1,009 teacher assistants:

- 43.4 percent hold an associate degree or higher (in any field), while 28.5 percent are working toward it;
- of the teacher assistants with less than an associate degree, 15.8 percent hold the CDA, and 5.3 percent are working toward it; and
- approximately 52.4 percent have a high school degree and do not hold a CDA. (Many of these teachers likely are public school employees who meet the requirements via No Child Left Behind.)

Teacher assistants employed by public schools are exempt from the requirement to hold a CDA if they meet the employment requirements of the federal No Child Left Behind legislation and have one of the following: 1) six documented hours of coursework in early childhood education, or 2) two years of work experience in an early childhood setting. Data on teacher assistants in this category are currently not available, but will be collected in future years.

Principals/Directors: *More at Four* and public school systems require principal licensure for public school sites. In SFY 2003-04, 48.7 percent of the 628 administrators (principals) hold this license, which is consistent with the approximate percentage of *More at Four* sites that are public schools. Additionally, three principals are working towards principal certification.

In SFY 2004-05, as of December 23, 2004, 53.6 percent of the 686 administrators (principals) hold this license. Additionally, five principals are working towards principal certification.

For child care centers, the *More at Four* standard is the N.C. Early Childhood Administration Credential (NCECAC) Level II, working toward Level III. For the remaining 50.8 percent of administrators in SFY 2003-04 who are child care center directors, the following credentials were reported:

- 44.5 percent hold a NCECAC Level III or are working toward it;
- 19.7 percent hold the NCECAC Level II; and
- 35.8 percent hold less than a Level II or indicate "Other" credentials.

Progress has been made for SFY 2004-05, as of December 23, 2004. For the remaining 45.6 percent of administrators who are child care center directors, the following credentials were reported:

- 55.8 percent hold a NCECAC Level III or are working toward it;
- 23.2 percent hold the NCECAC Level II; and
- 21.0 percent hold less than a Level II or indicate "Other" credentials.

E. SFY 2003-04 Expenditures and SFY 2004-05 Budget Data

Table 3 provides the expenditures of *More at Four* state funds for SFY 2003-04. Table 4 provides the budgeted amounts for *More at Four* state funds for SFY 2004-05. Percentages are similar for both years, with the vast majority of funding devoted to direct service delivery.

¹ SFY 2003-04 legislation requires that any unspent and unencumbered funds will be transferred to the DHHS Division of Child Development (DCD) at the end of the fiscal year for distribution to subsidy. \$800,000 was transferred to DCD for this purpose in SFY 2003-04.

As of December 27, 2004, all but \$237,573 of the \$44,904,685 state operational funds for SFY 2004-05 has been obligated or is under contract. Projected expenditures for the remaining fiscal year are tentative as of this report, as the predominant percentage of funding expended will be determined by local contract expenditures. The amount transferred to subsidy for SFY 2004-05 will be available in the May 1, 2005 report.²

Table 5 provides the expenditures of other resources accessed at the local level to support the *More at Four* program in SFY 2003-04, as reported by the *More at Four* contractors. Table 6 provides the projected amount of other resources accessed at the local level for SFY 2004-05, as of December 27, as reported by the *More at Four* contractors. Final reports from contractors on other resources accessed for SFY 2004-05 are due June 20, 2005. The amounts in Table 6 are approximate. Some of the differences between the two tables may reflect revised reporting of cash or in-kind, recoding to subsidy, or actual changes in sources accessed.

Total expenditures supporting *More at Four* classrooms for SFY 2003-04 are \$61,837,286, including state classroom operational funds and other resources accessed. Other resources accessed at the local level represent 46.6 percent of the classroom operating funding (not including one-time start-up funds.)

The total budget supporting *More at Four* classrooms for SFY 2004-05 is \$75,499,660, including state classroom operational funds and other resources accessed. Other resources accessed at the local level represent 40.5 percent of the classroom operating funding (not including one-time start-up funds).

Table 7 provides the state funds expended and statewide average per slot for SFY 2003-04.

A comprehensive cost analysis of the program for SFY 2004-05, including the cost per child served by the program, is not feasible until all expenditures are final at the end of the state fiscal year.

F. Preliminary Program and Child Findings: 2003-04 Results

For the first time in 2003-04, results were available by all 91 local programs, which covered all 100 counties. Some preliminary outcomes have been provided in the previous sections of this report; others are summarized briefly here.

The number of slots allocated and filled expanded rapidly over the first two months of the program, with almost 91 percent of the slots filled by September. Over three-quarters of the classrooms utilized the *Creative Curriculum*, with less than 15 percent using *Bright Beginnings*; no site used the *Bank Street* curriculum. Average class size was slightly more than 17 students, with 11.4 of these students part of the *More at Four* program. Forty-three percent of the students were African-American, 31.1 percent were white, and 17.8 percent were Hispanic or Latino. Over 84 percent of the students had never been served or were currently unserved in a child care or preschool program. Almost half of the students had 6 or more risk factor indicators (out of a total of 18) under Eligibility Model I and over 80 percent had a total risk score of 5 or more (out of 8) under Eligibility Model II. The average family income was \$17,366. The 11,208 children attended an average of 121.2 days.

Classroom practices were examined in 99 randomly-selected classrooms. Average ECERS-R (Early Childhood Environment Rating Scale – Revised) total scores were in the highest quality range, with 76 percent of these classrooms scoring at this level. In addition, scores for 5 of the 7 subscales averaged in the highest quality range. Curriculum implementation (MAC) scores averaged at the partial implementation level,

with *Creative Curriculum 3rd edition* and *Bright Beginnings* curriculum implementation scores the highest.

A sample of 514 children in 58 randomly-selected classrooms was assessed on measures of language and literacy skills, math skills, and general knowledge. Children showed significant developmental growth over the program year in all outcome areas.
