Background

The 2005 Session of the General Assembly enacted Senate Bill 565¹, which amended both General Statutes 66-58 (c), by adding (3d), and 115D-20(12), by re-writing this paragraph. The purpose of the amendments was to enable community college facilities to be used by private companies that have either loaned or donated equipment to the college.

This legislation was sought by the State Board of Community Colleges (State Board) on behalf of the fifty-eight member institutions, at their request. In effect, the law now permits a community college use of its personnel or facilities, in support of or by a private business enterprise, for the purpose of demonstrating equipment that has been either loaned or donated to a college by the business. The benefit to the college is that it receives much needed, cutting edge, and perhaps otherwise unaffordable equipment for instructional purposes in exchange for the loaning/donating party's demonstration thereof to prospective clients.

The two requirements that accompanied the legislations were that a college board of trustees adopt a local policy governing the use of its facilities by a private business enterprise; and, that the State Board report annually to the Joint Legislative Education Oversight Committee on the use of community college facilities, consistent with the legislation.

Reporting Requirement

Within the North Carolina Community College System Office, the Division of Business and Finance (Division) has responsibility for monitoring the inventory and reporting of equipment for all fifty-eight community colleges. As such, the reporting requirement was the responsibility of the Division.

In October 2006, the Division sent to each college a survey instrument to collect the information required by the legislation. Each college was required to report the business name, college program, date the equipment was received, a description thereof, and the status of the equipment.

Findings

Among the system colleges, four reported loaned or donated equipment that met the reporting requirement. The four college responses are included with this report. A summary of all responses is found in **Attachment A**.

In follow-up conversations with the colleges, there is nothing that was revealed to indicate that any of the four colleges that availed themselves of the legislation is out of compliance.
