

Status Report of Community Colleges Approved to Offer Lateral Entry Program

<u>Colleges</u>	<u>Current Enrollment</u>	<u>Issues Cited</u>
Alamance Community College	0	Plan to discontinue program because school system originally wanted six courses offered, but now only wants two.
Bladen Community College	0	Received many calls, but most potential teachers did not qualify to be admitted to the program.
Central Piedmont Community College	13	Enrollment is limited because the school system checks off some of the competencies and UNC Charlotte offers the full program on-line; they anticipate no completers .
Cleveland Community College	0	Students who are interested are not currently employed and can't be enrolled; local schools provide required training.
Coastal Carolina Community College	*	No response
Davidson County Community College	*	No response
Edgecombe Community College	10	No completers anticipated.
Gaston College	30	No completers; teachers meet competencies through local professional development. Students are also having trouble completing competencies through the university, especially the methods course.
Guilford Technical Community College	20	Teachers are required to complete Policies & Procedures training through the local system. There will be no completers.
Halifax Community College	3	There have not been any completers.
Lenoir Community College	0	No students have enrolled in classes offered due to restrictions.

<u>Colleges</u>	<u>Current Enrollment</u>	<u>Issues Cited</u>
Mitchell Community College	*	Not currently offering the program.
Montgomery Community College	*	Some teachers have taken individual courses, but there are no completers.
Richmond Community College	0	Courses have been offered but had to be cancelled due to low or no enrollment.
Roanoke-Chowan Community College	*	College plans to offer first classes in the fall of 2008.
Robeson Community College	0	Some special credit students have enrolled in the classes, but no teachers who need the courses have been out of college for five years. The five year rule makes program implementation difficult.
Rockingham Community College	12	There are no completers. Teachers get most of classes through LEA workshops. Lateral entry teachers need help, but not being allowed to enroll prior to being employed makes it difficult.
Sandhills Community College	*	No response
Southeastern Community College	0	College is not currently offering program. There are no completers anticipated because they meet the competencies by alternate ways.
Southwestern Community College	*	No response
Stanly Community College	0	No enrollment because so few potential students actually meet all the criteria to take the courses. Some “special credit” students have enrolled.
Vance-Granville Community College	0	There has been very little interest in our program to this point.
