Dear Senator Basnight:

The purpose of my letter to you is to respond to Session Law 2007-154, Section 2. Chapter 115-D of the General Statutes which was amended by adding a new subsection to read: "The State Board of Community Colleges shall develop curriculum and continuing education standards for courses of instruction in American Sign Language and shall encourage colleges to offer courses in American Sign Language (ASL) as a modern foreign language."

I am happy to report to you that the State Board of Community Colleges has approved American Sign Language courses for both Continuing Education and Curriculum programs. Currently, 16 of the 58 community colleges are offering ASL courses. The courses are at the beginning, intermediate, and advanced levels. During the 2007 spring and summer terms, 293 adult learners enrolled in these courses.

In the curriculum area, many of our community colleges incorporate ASL courses into a variety of approved programs. The following statement is placed on all curriculum standards to remind colleges that foreign language is approved as part of any curriculum program in the community college system: "Foreign language courses (including ASL) that are not designated as approved other major hours may be included in all programs up to a maximum of 3 semester hours of credit." These 3 hours of credit are in addition to ASL courses that may already be incorporated into the general education area of a program.

During the 2006-2007 year, approximately 234 students were enrolled in the Interpreter Education (A55300) program across the state. This program has increased in enrollment each year.
