Introduction:

North Carolina is home to seven major American military installations, including Camp Lejeune in Onslow County, Fort Bragg in Hoke County, Seymour Johnson Air Force Base in Wayne County, and Pope Air Force Base in Cumberland County along with the National Guard and the Reserves. With such a large number of military servicemen and servicewomen based in the state, many of North Carolina's school districts serve children with family members in the military. Given military action since 2001, many of these students are coping with stress as a result of deployments.

During its 2011 session, the General Assembly directed the State Board of Education to collect data on the students with immediate family members who have served in the Armed Forces of the United States since September 1, 2001. The reporting requirement applied to only local boards of education.

The General Assembly also directed the State Board of Education to investigate how school districts train staff members to support the unique needs of students from military-connected families. In Session Law 2011-185, section 9(b), the General Assembly defined six criteria of appropriate training to prepare staff members to serve this special group of students.

This report provides data on the number of children with immediate family members who have served in the military since September 1, 2001, in each school district in North Carolina. The report also outlines the training available to school staff members who support military-connected students.

Methodology:

To collect the data required for this report, schools across North Carolina sent home letters with students at the beginning of the school year. The Department of Public Instruction provided a sample letter, although it was customizable by local districts and boards of education. Parents and guardians responded to the letter by checking "yes" or "no" in response to the question:

Has an immediate family member of your child served in the U.S. Military (including the National Guard and the Reserves) since September 1, 2001?

The letter defined an immediate family member as a parent, guardian, grandparent, sibling, step-parent, aunt, or uncle. Districts also requested that parents and guardians respond to the question separately for each child in their household so as not to underrepresent sets of children who share an immediate family member, such as a parent.

The Department of Public Instruction designed an online system to collect information for this report. Each principal in the state accessed the system with their North Carolina Identity Management (NCID) and corresponding password, and then entered and verified the number of students in their school who had an immediate family member

serve in the military since September 2001. At the district-level, the testing director/coordinator was responsible for ensuring that each principal entered a number of students in the online system, as well as verifying the school-level data. The testing director/coordinator also responded to the questions about training for staff members after consulting with the superintendent, student support services director, and other central office staff.

The State Board of Education and Department of Public Instruction want to acknowledge limitations to the reporting method outlined above. First, it is likely that there are many students who have graduated or left North Carolina's public schools in the last eleven years, but who did have immediate family members serving in the Armed Forces of the United States since September 2001. Because they are no longer enrolled, they cannot be represented in the dataset used for this report.

Second, the process of sending forms home with students for parent/guardian responses never results in a 100 percent completion rate. Schools did send home the letter about this reporting at the beginning of the school year, when parents and guardians are expecting their students to bring home paperwork to be completed, including health forms and emergency contact forms. At this time of the year, parents and guardians are particularly attuned to communication from schools; the timing of the data collection likely resulted in a higher completion rate than if it had been done at another time in the school year.

Two DPI employees provided support and training to the military families. Ms. Linda Brannon collaborated with the Raleigh and Charlotte offices of Army Recruiters to provide a two day institute/workshop for school counselors and Career Development Coordinators this summer to help them better understand military careers, lifestyle and how to best support students of military families as well as provide other students knowledge of military careers. The workshop was entitled MCP 101 (Military Careers Pathways 101). The participants spent most of the 2 days on Fort Bragg working with various offices there to understand the "military lifestyle" and what steps occur with deployment from housing to transferring of schools and the educational process for students. In addition, the attendees also learned about various military careers and how these careers transfer to civilian life when their time in the military comes to an end. There were 30 educators involved in this institute. The end result from this experience was that the participants were taking the information back to their school communities to share with their colleagues in some type of project that is also in collaboration with their local military offices.

Mr. Doug Taggart serves as DPI's military liaison with a two-hour a week maximum. He attends installation school liaison officer meetings, as well as supports military families that call or email DPI. Typical calls are out of state families arriving in North Carolina who are looking for a place to get initial information. Questions might involve issues related to enrollment and custody/guardianship, transition, and graduation issues if the move involved a student in his/her senior year. Mr. Taggart supports the families by advocating for the military child as appropriate and within the constraints of the

interstate compact for educational opportunity for military children. Additionally, Doug coordinates an annual meeting of that state council.

Results:

Number of Students with Immediate Family Members in the Military

Table One in the Appendix provides an alphabetical listing of the 115 school districts in North Carolina, along with the number of students who are military-connected, the total number of students in the district, and the percentage of students in the district who are military-connected. Table Two provides the same information with districts ordered from the highest-percentage of students in the district who have an immediate family member who has served in the military since September 2001 to the lowest-percentage.

Table A presents data from the five districts with the highest percentages of students in the district who are military-connected.

Across the entire state, approximately 11 percent of the North Carolina's 1,409,895 students have immediate family members who have served in the military since September 2001.

District Training for School Staff Members Who Support Military-Connected Students

Table Three in the Appendix expands the information in Table One to include data on whether or not the districts have completed training that meets the criteria listed by the General Assembly, as well as the number of trainings they have completed. Table Four provides the same information with districts ordered from the highest-percentage of students in the district who have an immediate family member who has served in the military since September 2001 to the lowest-percentage.

Table B presents training information for the five districts with the highest percentages of students in the district who are military-connected.

Across the state, twelve school districts provided a combined 75 training opportunities for staff members who support students with immediate family members in the military.

Conclusion:

The counties that are home to North Carolina's largest military installations are also home to the largest percentages of students with immediate family members who have served in the Armed Forces since September 2001. Four of these five districts have provided trainings to staff members on how to support the special needs of these military-connected students.
