Virtual Charter Schools Survey

As part of the Appropriations Act of 2013, the North Carolina General Assembly has directed the State Board of Education to study and determine the needed modifications for authorization and oversight of virtual charter schools, including application requirements, enrollment growth, and funding allocations. A virtual charter school is defined in State Board of Education policy as, "a nonsectarian and nondiscriminatory public charter school open to all North Carolina students who are enrolled full-time at the virtual charter school. Students enrolled at a virtual charter school receive their education predominately through the utilization of online instructional methods."

The purpose of this study is to solicit feedback from key stakeholders across the state regarding the application requirements, operations (i.e., enrollment, growth, policy oversight), and funding allocations for virtual public charter schools in North Carolina. The survey should take about 15 minutes to complete and all information collected will be kept confidential. Findings will be used to inform the final virtual charter school study that will be provided to the Joint Legislative Education Oversight Committee in early 2014.

ADM is the daily sum of all students in membership for a month divided by the total days in a month. Charter schools are entitled to both state and local funding.
