Ensure Security of Student Records

The SBE shall notify the Governor and the General Assembly annually by October 1 of the following:

- (a) New student data, whether aggregate data, de-identified data, or personally identifiable student data, included or proposed for inclusion in the student data system for the current school year.
- (b) Changes to existing data collections for the student data system required for any reason, including changes to federal reporting requirements made by the United States Department of Education.

2014-15 list of new student-level data elements and their definitions that were added for collection in the state's student information management system.

1. In Response to Federal Reporting Requirements:

Office of Civil Rights (OCR) – Civil Rights Data Collection

• Additional elements added to PowerSchool to alleviate the burden on Local Education Agencies (LEAs) reporting to OCR.

 Added a code indicator of participation for identification within the statewide test results.

Refined PowerSchool to include Kindergarten health information

• Inclusion of Kindergarten data within the Health Module.

4. In Response to the State Board of Education GCS-L-007 and GCS-N-004 policies and G.S. §115C-12 (40):

Refined PowerSchool to include additional graduation and diploma endorsements data.
