Report to Joint legislative Education Oversight Committee

HB 97 (SL 2015-241) Section 8A.6 Limit Local Board of Education Waivers

Pursuant to **HB97** (**SL 2015-241**)**Section 8A.6 Limit Local Board of Education Waivers**, the State Board of Education shall report to the Joint Legislative Education Oversight Committee by October 15 of each year a list of specific waivers granted to each local board of education under this section. The General Assembly extended the date for the 2015 report until December 15, 2015.

Waivers for Class Size Requirements under G.S. 115C-301 (g)

The School Reporting Section is responsible for monitoring class size maximums in accordance with **G.S. 115C-301** and **Session Law 2013-363** (**House Bill 112**). The following process for monitoring and waiving class size is found in the *2014-2015 School Attendance and Student Accounting Manual*

Administration of Class Size

Local boards of education are required to maintain a <u>class size average across</u> the local education agency (the system) no higher than the class size ratio of teachers to students of the following (2014-2015 ratios):

Kindergarten	1 to 21
Grade 1	1 to 21
Grade 2	1 to 21
Grade 3	1 to 21
Grades 4 12	No Poquirom

Grades 4-12 No Requirement

During the first two months of school, <u>no class size</u> maximum requirements exist as long as the system-wide class size average maximums for each grade or grade span are not exceeded. At the end of the second school month and for the remainder of the school year, the size of an individual class may exceed the system-wide ratio by three students so long as the system-wide average class size maximums are not exceeded. Therefore, individual class size ratio maximums are:

Kindergarten	1 to 24
Grade 1	1 to 24
Grade 2	1 to 24
Grade 3	1 to 24

Grades 4-12 No Requirement

When a class contains a combination of grades for more than one grade span, the maximum class size will be determined by the grade span classification which constitutes the majority in the class. When teachers are assigned students in a team-teaching setting, each teacher in the team is considered to be responsible for an equal number of students in the class, regardless of how frequently the teacher actually teaches the students.

If individual class size exceeds 24 in grades K, 1, 2, or 3 at the end of the second school month and for the remainder of the school year, the local board has the responsibility to follow the steps set forth in **G.S. 115C-301(g)** and **G.S.115C-47(10)**. Study halls and homerooms are not counted when calculating average system-wide class size average. (All other classes are to be included in the calculation of system-wide class size averages.) Class size maximums apply to all K-3 teachers, including those that are state, federally, and locally funded.

Initial Reporting of Class Size

Under the provisions of **G.S. 115C-301(f) and G.S. 115C-47(10)** class size exceptions will be identified and reported via the School Activity Report (SAR). A school's SAR will be reported one week following the reporting of the Principal's Monthly Report for the second school month.

All class size overages not allowed by a waiver must be corrected by the system. Corrections may be made by reorganization of classes, by correcting inaccurate data at the school level, or by requesting a class size waiver from the State Board of Education (see III below). Corrected class size data must be reported. Class size overages in schools without waivers will be called to the attention of the State Board of Education.

Waivers Due to Excess Class Size

Under the provisions of **G.S. 115C-301(g), 115C-47(10)** local boards of education are responsible for assuring the class size requirements set forth in **G.S. 115C-301** are met. Any teacher who believes the requirements of **G.S. 115C-301** have not been met shall make a report to the principal and superintendent. The superintendent shall immediately determine whether the requirements have in fact not been met. If the superintendent determines the requirements have not been met, he or she shall make a report at the next local board of education meeting. The local board of education shall take action to meet the requirements of the statute. If the local board cannot organizationally correct the exception and if any of the conditions set out below are met, the board shall immediately apply to the State Board of Education for a waiver from the standards set above. The Superintendent of Public Instruction (the Superintendent) is authorized by the State Board of Education to review and respond to a system's request for a waiver of class size requirements for individual classes

Within 45 days of receipt of the request, the Superintendent may grant waivers for the excess class size in kindergarten through third grade: if the exception resulted from:

- a. Exceptional circumstances, emergencies, or acts of God (such as closing of classrooms due to fire, or other natural disaster; students transferring to a school during the middle of the school year, impractical combination classes),
- b. Significant growth in the school and grade population (caused by large military installation or business personnel transfers);
- c. Organizational problems caused by remote geographical location, or
- d. Classes organized for a solitary curricular area, and

No individual class size waiver has been requested for that specific school and grade during the previous school year, **and**

The waiver is for no more than two students above the established class size maximums, and

If the local board cannot organizationally correct the exception.

Penalty for Noncompliance

If the Superintendent determines that a local superintendent has willfully failed to comply with the requirements of this section, no State funds shall be allocated to pay the superintendent's salary for the period of time the superintendent is in noncompliance.

Requests for individual class size exception waivers require the completion of a form supplied by the School Reporting Section in the Division of School Business. Requests for individual class size waivers for classes out of compliance at the end of the second school month must be received by the Department of Public Instruction prior to November 30 of the current school year. Requests for individual class size waivers for classes out of compliance after the end of the second school month must be submitted as they occur. Waivers, when granted for a specific incidence, may remain in effect for the remainder of the current school year.

Upon notification from the Superintendent that the reported exception does not qualify for a waiver, the local board, within 30 days of receipt of the Superintendent's notification, shall take action necessary to correct the exception. A report of the action taken to alleviate the exception shall be sent to the School Reporting Section within 30 days of receipt of Superintendent's notification that the exception did not qualify for a waiver.

(**Note**: In grades 4-12, local school administrative units shall have the maximum flexibility to use allotted teacher positions to maximize student achievement. Charter schools are exempt from class size requirements.)

Attached (Attachment 1) is a list of waivers granted for class size during the 2014-2015 school year. Waiver requests for 2015-2016 will be reviewed according to the timetable and process described above.

Waivers for Calendar Requirements under G.S.115C-84.2(d)

The School Reporting Section is responsible for monitoring calendar waivers in accordance with **G.S.115C-84.2(d).** The following process for calendar waivers is found in the 2014-2015 School Attendance and Student Accounting Manual. The State Board may waive the school opening and closing dates for showing of good cause and allow the local education agency (the system) to set an opening date no earlier than the Monday closest to August 19.

Definition of "good cause"

"Good cause" is limited to severe weather conditions and is defined as all schools being closed for eight or more days during any four of the last ten years. Partial day closures are not included.

Missed Days

The State Board of Education may waive the opening and closing date requirement for any school system within a county where all schools have been closed for a full day, eight or more days per year during any four of the last ten years because of severe weather conditions, energy shortages, power failures or other emergency situations.

The Division of School Business will publish the system's ten-year history of missed days and identify those systems that are eligible to request a system-wide waiver. The system will choose one of two ten-year periods to determine its eligibility for a waiver. The first ten-year period option includes the last ten years (excluding the current year). The second ten-year period option includes the last ten years (including the current year). The system that chooses option one must submit a waiver request by August 15 for State Board of Education approval or denial for calendar development for the following school year. The system that chooses option two must submit a waiver by April 1 of the current year for State Board of Education approval or denial for the following school year. If approved, the waiver will be applicable to all schools within the system.

Attached (Attachments 2 & 3) are the lists of calendar waivers granted for the 2015-2016 school year and the 2016-2017 school year.

Waivers for Individual Student Growth Component of the Teacher Evaluation System

The North Carolina State Board of Education allowed local education agencies (the system) to apply for a waiver from individual student growth in classes covered by NC Final Exams and Analysis of Student Work. At its December 2015 State Board of Education meeting, the Board suspended the rules that allowed for a waiver. The Board suspended its rules in order for all teachers, where practicable, to have individual student growth data. The Board reversed its opinion based on direction from the General Assembly in **HB 97** (**SL 2015-241**) **Section 8A** regarding the limiting of waivers and **HB 97** (**SL 2015-241**) **Section 8.41(a)** that requires a clinical educator to have met growth in the field of licensure sought by the student teacher. (115C-296.11 (b) (3) c.) Effective with the 2016-2017 school year, school systems will use the state model for individual student growth or they may develop their own model that provides individual student growth, where practicable.

School systems that had active waivers at the beginning of the 2015-2016 school year will be allowed to exercise their waivers for the remainder of the 2015-2016 school year; however, no additional waivers will be granted. All waivers regarding student growth will be rescinded at the end of the 2015-2016 school year.

Attached are lists (Attachments 4 & 5) of the school systems with active waivers for individual student growth.
