# **Committee on Low Performing Districts and Schools, Improvement Planning, and Statewide Support**

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## **Executive Summary**

G. S. §115C-12(25) requires the State Board of Education to submit a report to the Joint Legislative Education Oversight Committee (JLEOC) annually regarding districts and schools identified as low-performing, effective improvement planning, and recommendations for additional legislation to improve student performance and increase local flexibility.

This report contains information regarding the implementation of new and/or amended statute in G. S. §115C-105.37. Identification of low-performing schools and G. S. §115C-105.39A. Identification of low-performing local school administrative units. Specifically, the report provides a summary about the results of the steps and process developed and implemented by the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction to support those districts and schools identified as low performing from the 2014-15 results, and a summary of the 2015-16 accountability results for low performing districts and schools around the School Performance Grades and EVAAS Growth status. Additionally, the report includes the plans for reviewing and providing feedback on the improvement plans based on the 2015-16 results and appendices with the resources, documents, and calendar of events to be provided to districts and schools across the state with low performing schools.

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## Overview of Legislation and District/School Data

The following report provides a brief summary of legislation about the definition of low performing schools and low performing local school administrative units. In addition, the report provides a general analysis of trends and patterns identified in the plans submitted to the Department of Public Instruction for feedback. Also included in the report are the final results of performance and growth data for low performing districts and schools for the 2015–16 school year based on the analysis of School Performance Grades (SPG) and EVAAS Growth data according to the End of Grade (EOG) and End of Course (EOC) assessments, which are aligned to the North Carolina Standard Course of Study in English Language Arts/Reading and Mathematics and the Essential Standards in Science, for all public schools and public charter schools. The report specifically presents the following information and data:

1. Summary of the legislation concerning low performing districts and schools,
2. Summary of findings based on the submitted Low Performing Local School Administrative Units' and Schools' improvement plans,
3. Summary analysis of the 2015-16 Accountability results, and
4. Overview of the projected timeline and process for the improvement plans based on the 2015-16 low performing results.

### *Legislation*

In September 2015, Session Law 2015-241 House Bill 97, provided amended definitions for low performing schools and a new designation for low performing districts. Included in both the amended and new designations were specifically defined processes, procedures, and requirements for low performing schools and districts. The following tables provide summary information regarding the legislative changes having an immediate impact on North Carolina schools and districts now designated as low performing and the requirements based on the new legislation:

*Trends and Patterns from Low Performing Plans*

Examining how low performing schools combine and/or implement improvement practices is an important first step to better understanding why some schools are successful in improving low performance. The plans for improvement submitted by low performing districts and schools contained strategies developed by the improvement teams and were submitted to NCDPI’s District and School Transformation division for feedback. Many of the plans contained similar strategies for addressing the needs in low performing schools and the data summarized in Table 3 also suggests implications for possible changes in legislation as well as the need for ongoing professional development to continue to build the capacity of district and school personnel. Identifying these trends has been an integral aspect of developing and continuing effective practices of support through inter-agency collaboration, service and support teams, varying professional development offerings and direct coaching for classroom, building level and district level personnel.

In addition to the themes identified through these plans, the North Carolina State Board of Education (NCSBE) sought to identify practices that nationally supported school and district improvement. Successful implementation with fidelity of the components of the school reform models Transformation, Turnaround, Restart, and Closure showed promise in improving chronically under performing schools nationally. Aligning with North Carolina’s law for reform of low performing schools (G.S. 115C-105.37B) the NCSBE adopted a policy allowing recurring low performing schools an opportunity to apply for approval to implement components of these reform initiatives. Summarized information about each reform initiative can be found in Table 4. Recurring low performing schools are those schools that have been low performing for two of the previous three consecutive years. The list of recurring low performing schools for 2015-16 can be found in the Appendix.

**Table 4: School Reform Models**

<b>Transformation</b>	In order to qualify for implementation of the transformation model, the LEA must demonstrate that a school has created a plan for developing and improving teacher and school leader effectiveness; for implementing comprehensive instructional reform strategies; for increasing learning time; for creating community-oriented schools; and for providing operational flexibility and sustain support. The LEA shall submit specific goals for academic achievement and shall submit a budget showing the revenues and expenditures needed to reach the goals.
<b>Turnaround</b>	In order to qualify for implementation of the turnaround model, the LEA submits specific grounds supporting the implementation of this model; specifies the academic goals expected from implementation of this model; specifies the procedures to be utilized in removing staff, including procedures consistent with Due Process; describes with specificity the new governance structure and the budget to be implemented; sets forth specific academic achievement expected to be realized from use of this model.
<b>Restart</b>	In order to qualify for implementation of the restart model, the LEA submits a detailed plan outlining the goals to be achieved, including how to provide each student with the opportunity for a sound basic education; a statement as to how operating the school with the same exemptions from statutes and rules as a charter school authorized under N.C.G.S. 115C-218 et seq. will facilitate accomplishing these goals; how these exemptions will increase student achievement; whether the LEA will employ an educational management organization and, if so, the name and credentials of that organization and a budget setting out anticipated revenue and expenditures necessary to achieve the goal. A school operated under this subdivision remains under the control of the local board of education, and employees assigned to the school are employees of the local school administrative unit.
<b>Closure</b>	In order to qualify for implementation of the closure model, the LEA submits the specific grounds recommending closure of a particular school; the procedures it intends to follow in closing the school, including opportunities for public hearing; the procedures for ensuring a smooth transition for employee and students affected by the closure; how the resources realized from closure will continue to support student achievement, and the specific academic gains expected to be realized by the closure.



## Low Performing Districts and Schools

In September of 2016 the NC State Board of Education approved the lists of low performing schools, traditional and charter, and low performing local school administrative units and recurring low performing schools. The full list of schools and districts can be found in the Appendix beginning on page 15. The table below provides a summary of the low performing schools and districts by NC State Board Region.

When comparing the results from 2014-15 to 2015-16, there is an overall decrease of 93 low performing schools, from 581 to 488. The same is true when comparing the low performing districts in 2014-15 to 2015-16, with a decrease of 5. Further analysis of the data shows a breakdown of schools and districts that remain on the list, the totals that are no longer low performing and those schools and districts newly identified in the recent release of Accountability results. Table 6 provides the summary of schools and districts removed, newly identified, the net change and new total from the 2015-16 data.

## Overview of North Carolina Department of Public Instruction Support

The North Carolina Department of Public Instruction (NCDPI) provides a series of support services to guide districts and schools through the requirements. Upon the State Board’s initial approval of the low performing local administrative units’ and low performing schools’ lists, immediate communication was shared with all superintendents and charter school directors regarding next steps. In the month of September, 2016 the Department’s District and School Transformation (DST) Division will provide multiple opportunities to attend a webinar explaining the requirements of the law and the processes and procedures in place to support districts and schools through the requirements. At the same time DST, in collaboration with NCDPI’s Educator Effectiveness Division and Federal Programs and Monitoring Division will provide training to schools and districts on the NCStar tool which all low performing schools will utilize to develop and monitor implementation of their school improvement plan.

Table 7 below lists the support and corresponding resources provided to all districts and schools. Included in the Appendix are samples of each of the resources listed.

### *District and School Transformation Service and Support*

To embed strategies that should support long-term sustained progress for low performing districts and schools, District and School Transformation Division will continue to work collaboratively with the district and/or school to provide both professional development and direct in-school, customized coaching support designed to develop the leadership capacity of central office staff, principals, and teachers. Following are strategies implemented by the division to support and serve the districts and schools identified above:

## **Comprehensive Needs Assessments**

Comprehensive Needs Assessments involve the collection and analysis of data to assess districts' and schools' processes, procedures, and instructional practices and their impact on student learning. Prior to the assessment, professional development is provided to principals and central office staff that explains the following:

- the Comprehensive Needs Assessment process;
- the rubric utilized during the district/school assessment;
- personnel's role in the assessment; and
- preparation of a Self-Evaluation that begins the review process.

The site visit conducted as part of the process consists of the following:

- collaborative discussions with district and school leadership;
- classroom visits; and
- focus group sessions with teachers, students, and parents.

The assessment culminates with a report that

- triangulates the evidence found during the assessment process;
- is written in draft form and sent to district and school leadership for a check of factual accuracy; and
- is finalized and provided to district, school, and Department of Public Instruction leaders.

## **Coaching for Sustainable Change**

In addition to the information provided through a comprehensive assessment, transformation coaches are provided to the identified districts and schools. Transformation coaches have the specific responsibility to build the capacity of teachers, principals, and superintendents to implement and sustain reform and innovation and to ensure that all students graduate prepared for college and work.

Two models utilized by District and School Transformation address the needs of the 15 districts and 75 schools served. The District Transformation model provides support at three levels within the district: district leadership, school leadership, and classroom instruction. The School Transformation model provides support at two levels within the school: school leadership and classroom instruction.

The following descriptions of the three levels of coaching support identify the major responsibilities of the District and School Transformation coach at the district, school, and instructional level.

### **District Leadership Coaching**

District Transformation Coaches (DTCs) have been assigned to work with the superintendents in low performing school districts. These coaches have had successful experience as a superintendent or central office administrator and have strong interpersonal skills, knowledge about state and federal accountability models, and an understanding of the change process. Responsibilities of the District Transformation Coaches include the following:

- building collaborative partnerships with leadership;
- facilitating the planning processes for change;
- coordinating the resources of the Department of Public Instruction divisions to serve the district; and
- encouraging and monitoring the use of research-based best practices.

### **School Leadership Coaching**

School Transformation Coaches (STCs) have been assigned to work with principals of the schools served and to develop these principals as instructional leaders consistent with the North Carolina Standards for School Executives. These coaches are former principals who are knowledgeable about state and federal accountability models; who understand change management processes; who have the capacity to realize potential and provide support to ensure success; who understand alignment of curriculum, instruction, and assessment; and who have effective interpersonal skills. Responsibilities of the STCs include the following:

- leading change that advances student achievement;
- facilitating planning processes, coaching, and service delivery;
- communicating clearly with the principal, District Transformation Coach, Instructional Coaches, and Department of Public Instruction staff;
- facilitating a productive climate for the school to organize tasks and make effective decisions; and
- modeling effective, research-based instructional practices.

### **Instructional Coaching**

Instructional Coaches (ICs) have been assigned to provide on-site support for classroom teachers. This coaching is designed to develop teachers as leaders who take responsibility for the progress of all students, a focus which is consistent with the North Carolina Professional Teaching Standards. ICs have had successful experiences as classroom teacher leaders; are knowledgeable of state and federal accountability models; demonstrate a thorough understanding of North Carolina's Standard Course of Study; and have expertise in best instructional practices, classroom management, effective professional development, and curricular alignment. The responsibilities of the ICs include the following:

- providing on-site, job-embedded professional development;
- leading change to advance student achievement;
- modeling classroom instructional strategies;
- communicating with school and district leadership, District and School Transformation Coaches, as well as Department of Public Instruction staff; and
- building capacity and developing structures that support sustainable improvement and change.

Dear Superintendents:

Congratulations on a successful opening of schools. Since approximately sixty-five percent of the school districts in the state are impacted by the low performing statute, we included all of you in this correspondence. As a superintendent of a district with one or more schools that were identified as low performing or a superintendent seeking further information regarding low performing schools and districts, we would like to invite you to read the information below and act accordingly.

As you know the law regarding low performing schools and districts was implemented last year for the first time. As a reminder, the following information provides an overview of the current statutory definition and requirements for low performing districts and schools:

Definitions:

Low Performing LEAs are those administrative units in which the majority of the schools in that unit have been identified as low-performing (*NC G.S. 115C-39A*).

Low Performing Schools are those schools receiving a D or F School Performance Grade **and** a “met expected growth” or “not met expected growth” status (*NC G.S. 115C-105.37*).

Requirements:

All low performing schools and districts are required to submit plans for improving School Performance Grades and student growth to the NC State Board of Education

Earlier in the summer we communicated that for the 2016-17 school year low performing school plans would be submitted through our NCStar system, a system many of you have utilized in Priority and Focus Schools as well as district wide by request. Utilizing this tool should prevent schools from having multiple plans for improvement, establish a system to keep the improvement planning process an active practice and allow schools to receive the statute required feedback from a NCDPI coach assigned through the system.



The training for the NCStar system has been going on across the state all summer in each of the regions and your involvement and enthusiasm has been great! Because we understand the summer is a busy time with people in and out of schools, we want to provide additional regionally based training sessions through our collaboration with Federal Program and Monitoring. The attached document includes a map with dates, times and places for upcoming training in October that allows ample time to have the training, plans developed and submitted through the system for feedback and meet the statute required timeline.

The feedback for the plans will be provided through the Service Support Teams across the state. Team members will be assigned as coaches through the NCStar system and may create opportunity for a dynamic conversation between school improvement teams and the state's Service Support Teams. Needs identified in this process could help us identify topics for Principal Ready, Assistant Principal Ready, and other professional development opportunities.

If this is your first experience with the low performing statute, or reviewing the requirements would be helpful, we will offer a webinar explaining in greater detail the specific requirements in the law. The webinar(s) will take place at the times listed below:
