STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION

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SBE MISSION: The State Board of Education will use its constitutional authority to lead and uphold the system of public education in North Carolina.

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Summary of the Legislation

Appropriations Bill 2016-94 Section 8.8 appropriated \$4,300,000 to pay teachers of Advanced Placement (AP) and International Baccalaureate (IB) students bonuses based on the exam results.

The bonus is based on exams taken in the 2015-16 school year, is specified as \$50 per exam at a grade 3 or above on AP or 4 or above on IB, and has a maximum of \$2,000 per teacher per year. To be eligible the teacher must be teaching advanced courses in the same local education agency (LEA) at least until the bonus is paid in January. The full text of the legislation is provided in Appendix A

State Board of Education Policy

State Board of Education (SBE) approved the allotment policy for the distribution of the funds in their November 2016 meeting. The full policy is presented in Appendix B.

Distribution of Funds

The Department of Public Instruction (DPI) distributed the funds to the LEAs based on the SBE policy. The allocations are available by LEA in Appendix C.

The allocations are an estimate by LEA based on the number of exams eligible for a bonus, as reported by The College Board and International Baccalaureate. These allocations are the maximum that will be paid out and due to the eligibility requirements of the teacher and the cap, it is anticipate that not all the funds will be dispersed.

The data on the number of teachers paid and the amounts paid was not available at the time of this report. Supplemental data will be provided when the data is available.

Reporting Requirement

The State Board shall report on the amount of bonuses awarded to advanced course teachers, including the amount awarded for Advanced Placement courses and the amount awarded for International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme courses, to the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the Fiscal Research Division by March 15, 2017.

Appendix A

ADVANCED PLACEMENT/INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE TEACHER BONUS PILOT PROGRAM

SECTION 8.8.(a) The State Board of Education shall establish the Advanced Placement/International Baccalaureate Pilot Program (pilot program) to reward advanced course teacher performance and to encourage student learning and improvement. To attain this goal, the Department of Public Instruction shall administer bonus pay for two school years to licensed teachers of advanced courses, beginning with data from the 2015-2016 school year, in accordance with the following:

- (1) A bonus in the amount of fifty dollars (\$50.00) for each student taught by an advanced course teacher in each advanced course who receives the following score:
 - a. For Advanced Placement courses, a score of three or higher on the College Board Advanced Placement Examination.
 - b. For International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme courses, a score of four or higher on the International Baccalaureate course examination.
- (2) No teacher shall be awarded a bonus pursuant to this subsection that exceeds two thousand dollars (\$2,000) in any given school year. The bonus awarded to a teacher pursuant to this subsection shall be in addition to any regular wage or other bonus the teacher receives or is scheduled to receive.
- (3) For advanced course scores collected from the 2015-2016 school year and the 2016-2017 school year, bonuses awarded pursuant to this subsection are payable in January 2017 and January 2018, respectively, to qualifying advanced course teachers who remain employed teaching advanced courses in the same local school administrative unit at least from the school year the data is collected until the corresponding school year that the bonus is paid.

SECTION 8.8.(b) For the purposes of this section, an "advanced course" shall mean an Advanced Placement or International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme course.

SECTION 8.8.(c) Notwithstanding G.S. 135-1(7a), the compensation bonuses awarded under this section are not compensation under Article 1 of Chapter 135 of the General Statutes, the Teachers' and State Employees' Retirement System.

SECTION 8.8.(d) The State Board of Education shall report on and study the pilot program as follows:

- (1) The State Board shall report on the amount of bonuses awarded to advanced course teachers, including the amount awarded for Advanced Placement courses and the amount awarded for International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme courses, to the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the Fiscal Research Division by March 15, 2017, and again by March 15, 2018.
- (2) The State Board shall study the effect of the pilot program on advanced course teacher performance and retention. The State Board shall report the results of its findings to the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the Fiscal Research Division, and the Joint Legislative Education Oversight Committee by March 15, 2018.

SECTION 8.8.(e) For the 2017-2018 fiscal year only, the Director of the Budget shall also include in the base budget, as defined by G.S. 143C-1-1(d)(1c), the amount of nonrecurring funds needed to support the pilot program.

SECTION 8.8.(f) This section expires June 30, 2018.

Advanced Placement/International Baccalaureate Teacher Bonus

TYPE: Dollars

TERM: July 1, 2016 to June 30, 2018

PURPOSE: A two-year pilot program which provides funding to reward teachers of students

successfully achieving in Advanced Placement (AP) and International

Baccalaureate (IB) examinations.

ELIGIBILITY: Each LEA is entitled to funding, based on the exam results of their students.

A teacher shall receive a bonus in the amount of fifty dollars (\$50.00) for each student taught by an advanced course teacher who receives the following score:

a. For AP courses, a score of three or higher on the College Board Advanced

Placement Examination.

b. For IB Diploma Programme courses, a score of four or higher on the

International Baccalaureate course examination.

FORMULAS: Each LEA is allotted funds based on the number of AP and IB exams that meet

the eligibility, as reported to the DPI from the respective examination board.

SPECIAL PROVISIONS:

- 1. No teacher shall be awarded a bonus that exceeds two thousand dollars (\$2,000) in any given school year. The bonus awarded to a teacher shall be in addition to any regular wage or other bonus the teacher receives or is scheduled to receive.
- 2. Bonuses are payable in January 2017 and January 2018, respectively, to qualifying advanced course teachers who remain employed teaching advanced courses in the same LEA at least from the school year the data is collected until the corresponding school year that the bonus is paid.
- 3. The bonuses are not considered compensation for purposes of the Teachers' and State Employees' Retirement System.
- 4. Unused funds shall not be used for any purpose other than stipulated in the legislation. Excess funds allotted shall revert to the State.
- 5. A Student must be enrolled and have attained a grade in the corresponding course for a teacher to be eligible for a bonus associated to the exam result.
- 6. Teachers employed by a LEA are eligible, including teachers employed by a LEA and teaching advanced classes through NC Virtual Public School (NCVPS).

- 2. Teacher may receive a maximum bonus of \$2,000 per year.
- 3. To be eligible the teacher must remain employed teaching advanced courses in the SAME LEA at least until the bonus is paid.
- 4. Allotment includes social security. Bonus is not subject to retirement.
- 5. Unused funds are not authorized for any other use.
