Report to the North Carolina General Assembly: §115C-83.4A ~ Advanced Courses

In response to G.S.115C-83.4A, the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction (NCDPI) initially established the NC Advanced Placement Partnership (NCAPP) in May 2014 with the College Board. The NCAPP continues with its purpose to broaden access and successful participation in advanced coursework in North Carolina's (NC) public schools. According to G.S. 115C-83.4A, "it is the intent of the State of North Carolina to enhance accessibility and encourage students to enroll in and successfully complete more rigorous advanced courses to enable success in postsecondary education for all students."

The NCAPP continues to respond to the legislation through various efforts. In 2018-19, twenty-two NC school districts participated in the NCAPP as "targeted districts" with focused support and technical assistance. For this 2019-20 academic year, twenty-one districts are participating with the NCAPP as targeted districts, and most are low-performing. NCAPP continued with districts who still needed support and were committed to the program. By increasing the number on NCAPP team, the Partnership has grown to have further state-wide impact. Currently, there are three full-time staff dedicated from College Board to the NCAPP. NCAPP also provides state-wide support through professional development opportunities open to all public school districts across the state, both face-to-face and online opportunities. College Board and the NCDPI are continuing to work together on these various aspects to ensure continued success of the NCAPP.

In addition, the General Assembly continues to appropriate funds to pay for all Advanced Placement (AP) and International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IB) exams for public school and charter school students who were enrolled in the corresponding AP/IB courses; this began in 2014-15. Beginning 2016-17, legislation included Cambridge International Exams (CIE) to this effort.

Alongside NC's public school districts, the NCAPP spearheads NC's progress with AP course enrollment and AP exam participation. After years of continued gains and positive trends, the state's most recent data shows a decrease in the areas of AP exam participation and performance in 2018-19 and course enrollment for 2019-20. Below are some key highlights that are detailed further in the report:

- Currently in 2019-20, 77,579 students are taking at least one AP course. These
 students represent 149,538 course enrollments in NC public schools. This
 represents a decrease of 4.8% of students taking at least one AP course compared
 to last year's enrollment of 81,520. The decline began last year with a 1%
 decrease in course enrollment.
- The number of AP Exam-Takers in North Carolina's public schools decreased 1.5% from 2018 to 2019, as compared to a 0.6% increase in AP Exam-Takers in public schools nationwide. This still represents a 10% increase of AP Exam-Takers in NC's public schools over the last five years since the beginning of NCAPP. In the target NCAPP districts, the number of students taking AP exams decreased by 13.6% in 2019 over the 2018 year, even with the NCAPP efforts.
- The number of AP Exams taken in North Carolina's public schools decreased 3.6% from 2018 to 2019. This still represents a 9% increase over the last five years. In the target NCAPP districts, the number of AP Exams taken decreased by 14.9% in 2019 over the 2018 year, even with the NCAPP efforts.
- The number of AP Examinees scoring 3 or better on AP exams in North Carolina's public schools decreased 1.6% from 2018 to 2019. This still represents a 16% increase over the last five years since the NCAPP began. In the 22 target NCAPP districts, the number of AP Examinees scoring 3 or better on AP exams decreased by 18.0% in 2019 over the 2018 year.
- AP Participation and performance for Hispanic students in North Carolina's public schools continues to *outpace* the participation and performance for Hispanic students seen nationwide. The number of Hispanic AP Exam-Takers in North

Carolina's public schools increased 5.3% from 2018 to 2019, as compared to a 3.0% increase in Hispanic AP Exam-Takers in public schools nationwide. Hispanic students' exams attaining a 3+ score increased 4.6% over last year in NC, outpacing the 3.5% growth for the same group nationwide.

- The number of Black AP Exam-Takers in North Carolina's public schools decreased 3.1% from 2018 to 2019, as compared to a 0.6% increase in Black AP Exam-Takers in public schools nationwide. Black students' exams attaining a 3+ score decreased 2.0% over last year in NC. Every year prior to last year, NC has outpaced the nation with an increase of Black AP Exam-Takers. For example, in 2014, Black AP Exam-Takers increased 22.8% in NC compared to 3.6% nationwide.
- The number of Black AP Exam-Takers in North Carolina's public schools decreased 3.1% from 2018 to 2019, as compared to a 0.6% increase in Black AP Exam-Takers in public schools nationwide. Black students' exams attaining a 3+ score decreased 2.0% over last year in NC. Every year prior to last year, NC has outpaced the nation with an increase of Black AP Exam-Takers. For example, in 2014, Black AP Exam-Takers increased 22.8% in NC compared to 3.6% nationwide.

The overall success to broaden access and successful participation in advanced courses has been a result of hard work by NC's teachers and districts and the investment by the state of NC. NCDPI will be working with College Board and school districts to further examine the changes in the data to ensure even more intentional strategies to support growth and examine any issues that are causing this change in course enrollment and success. With NCAPP's sustained efforts of professional development and technical assistance, the State Board of Education (SBE) and NCDPI hope for progress to increase access and successful participation in Advanced Placement courses across NC and further meet the intent of the legislation.

Basic Status and Efforts of NCAPP

NCAPP Targeted Districts

NCDPI and College Board began a new cohort of targeted districts for this academic year. NCDPI and College Board invited additional low--performing districts to continue as part of the NCAPP with focused participation as well as updated the level of participation of the initial cohort based on need. Twenty-one of the twenty-two school districts that participated last year continue with the NCAPP for 2019-20. The current twenty-one target school districts are low-performing in the areas of ACT composite, math rigor, overall performance composite scores, and AP participation and performance. Each year, NCAPP and NCDPI will continue to re-evaluate the districts participating based on new levels of need to ensure effective implementation.

NCAPP State-Wide Efforts

In addition to focused district support through professional development and technical assistance, NCAPP continues to work with state-wide efforts as well. Particularly, each school district across the state is invited to send a select number of high school AP teachers to participate in content-based professional development opportunities throughout the year. Further state-wide efforts with regional technical assistance through the SBE regions and state-wide webinars to support systemic change and program development have also been developed and shared.

NCDPI Response to NCAPP Report

NCDPI received the College Board's NCAPP Annual Report in September 2019 and again in October 2019 with data corrections. The report reflects the progress of the NCAPP over for the last year as well as exam performance information. NCDPI is pleased with the progress of the NCAPP through the launch of AP2019, which has brought many changes to schools across the nation and more curricular support for teachers. NCDPI has concern regarding the data presented in the Annual Report submitted by College Board, but it realizes the changes that AP2019 brings will not only support teachers through curriculum but also with better progress monitoring capabilities. The College Board is committed to serving NC school districts and continues to partner with NCDPI to ensure effective implementation.

Distribution of NCAPP Funding for AP, IB, and CIE Exam Fees

For the payment of AP Exams for the May 2019 exam administration, NCDPI paid College Board **\$12,185,181** to support NC's public school students and families. NCDPI and College Board have developed a state-wide invoicing system to facilitate effective payment and lessen the burden of high schools and their districts.

NCDPI particularly notes the continued success of the implementation of the state-covered AP exam fees. College Board and NCDPI continue to work together with NC's school districts and high schools and charter schools to improve this process. NCDPI appreciates the hard work of all involved to ensure that students' test fees were covered.

For the payment of IB Exams and Fees for the May 2019 exam administration, NCDPI paid International Baccalaureate Organization (IBO) **\$1,470,469** to support NC's public school students and families. NCDPI and IBO have developed a full state invoice process to better facilitate payment and lessen the burden of billing on high schools and their districts.

For the payment of Cambridge International Exams and Fees for the May 2019 exam

administration, NCDPI paid Cambridge Assessment **\$48,001.31** to support NC's public school students and families.

AP/IB/CIE Current Course Enrollment Data

Currently in 2019-20, there is a decrease of the number of students taking at least one AP course and course enrollments compared to last year's enrollment. NCDPI will be working to better understand the causes and work with districts strategically. This year, 77,579 students are taking at least one AP course. These students represent 149,538 course enrollments. This represents a decrease of 4.8% in the number of students and a decrease of 1.8% in course enrollments from last year.

I. Mission and Purpose of the NC AP Partnership:

The mission of the Partnership between The College Board and the state of North Carolina is to prepare, inspire, and connect students to postsecondary success and opportunity, with a particular focus on minority students and students who are underrepresented in postsecondary education. The purpose of the Partnership is therefore to assist in improving college readiness of secondary students and to assist secondary schools to ensure that students have access to high-quality, rigorous academics with a focus on access to Advanced Placement courses.

II. Driving Governance:







AP Exam Performance (see p. 4-21 for school level details):

The number of AP Exam-Takers in North Carolina's public schools decreased 1.5 % from 2018 to 2019, as compared to a 0.6% increase in AP Exam-Takers in public schools nationwide. In total 74,209 NC public school students took 135,741 AP exams, with 73,195 receiving a proficient score. This represents a 3.6 % decrease of exams taken, and a 1.6 % decrease of exams attaining a 3+ score over last year.

- AP participation and performance for Hispanic students in North Carolina's public schools continues to
 outpace the participation and performance for Hispanic students seen nationwide. The number of
 Hispanic AP Exam-Takers in North Carolina's public schools increased 5.3% from 2018 to 2019, as
 compared to an 3.0% increase in Hispanic AP Exam-Takers in public schools nationwide. The number of
 Hispanic students' exams attaining a 3+ score increased 4.6% over last year in NC, outpacing the 3.5%
 growth for the same group nationwide.
- The number of Black AP Exam-Takers in North Carolina's public schools decreased 3.1% from 2018 to 2019, as compared to a 0.6% increase in Black AP Exam-Takers in public schools nationwide, and Black students' exams attaining a 3+ score decreased 2.0% over last year, as compared to 2.7% growth for the same group nationwide.

• Number of students participating in 10th grade PSAT/NMSQT testing: **October 2018: 33,694 Tests; 2019 orders as of Sept.: 32,105 tests.** Students taking the SAT with the PSAT/NMSQT as a Junior and Sophomore or younger continue to score higher than the national average (SAT Evidence-Based Reading and Writing 578 – 36 points higher than the national average; SAT Mathematics 571 – 39 points higher than the national average) while students taking the SAT without the PSAT/NMSQT continue to score lower than the national average (SAT Evidence-Based Reading and Writing 502 – 40 points below the national average; SAT Mathematics 489 – 43 points below the national average).

North Carolina Data Summary Report

I The International Baccalaureate.

The International Baccalaureate Programmes; Primary Years, Middle Years, Diploma and Career-related have a core goal to guide students towards the skills needed to be lifelong learners.

All 4 of the IB Programmes offer a student centered, inquiry-based approach to an international education, focused on approaches to learning for all ages, including research, communications, social, self-management and thinking skills. As these skills develop through participation in IB programmes students become confident in their ability to succeed in challenges at any stage in life.

I Schools

Schools and students in North Carolina have been participating in International Baccalaureate programmes since the first school was authorized in Charlotte-Mecklenburg in 1992. There has been steady growth both in the number of programmes offered as well as the number of schools involved. **74** schools, **up 5 from 2018**, in North Carolina currently offer the IBO's Programmes; Primary Years (PYP), Middle Years (MYP), Diploma (DP) or Career-related (CP).

- There are; 19 PYP, 24 MYP, 33 DP and 4 CP programmes
- There are 17 candidate schools in the state working towards authorization to offer 19 programmes



• This steady growth is testimony to the successful efforts of the schools, districts and the state to increase participation in the programmes and to support students in their efforts to succeed. III Performance data for students in the IB Diploma and Career-related programmes includes;

- There were **9328** examinations written by these students. The IB exams are rigorous and measure competencies in many learning skills, as well as subject knowledge.
- Of these exams **5507** achieved scores of **4** or better on the IB scale of 1 through 7.
- 1265 students immediately requested the transcripts of their IB success be sent to universities they plan to attend. Participation in IB coursework is an important contributor to admission decisions at most Universities.

IV Post-Secondary success.

- Participation in IB coursework is a significant factor in admissions decisions at North Carolina Public and Private Universities and at Universities throughout the US, Canada and around the world.
- A score of 4 or 5 or better often leads to credit and placement options at many universities in the US including those in North Carolina.

V Support for students, teachers and schools

The IBO's goal is to provide students an opportunity to learn and develop skills in a setting where they are engaged by teachers using the most up to date pedagogical practices. We want all students to be able to participate successfully in their learning.

- Authorization of Schools.
 - We provide consultants and guidance during the 2 to 3 year process to help them to be successful in becoming an IB authorized school.
- Required Professional Development for teachers and administrators
 - exceptional workshops show school leaders and teachers how to deliver the programme. In 2019 slightly over 1200 North Carolina teachers and administrators participated in our Professional workshops.
- Programme Resource Centre
 - Teachers and coordinators have access to a globally subscribed Programme Resource Centre. The PRC contains proven resource material to help teachers and coordinators to be successful. From Oct 1, 2018 through Sept 30, 2019 there were 2005 user visits to the PRC from teacher and coordinators in North Carolina. Educators in the state are demonstrating their commitment to excellent practice through the workshop and PRC participation.
- IBO Staff support
 - There are specific IBO staff for NC schools assigned to authorized and candidate schools who help with the process of becoming an authorized IB school and with the work that continues towards improvement once authorized.
