# **Water and Environment**

#### DAMS

- North Carolina's dam safety program has 16.62 Full-Time Employees that each oversee an average of 179 state regulated dams.
- 38% of the state regulated high hazard dams in North Carolina have an Emergency Action Plan.
- North Carolina's state dam safety program has an annual budget of \$1,235,561.

#### **HAZARDOUS WASTE**

North Carolina has 37 sites on the National Priorities List.

### **LEVEES**

· North Carolina has approximately 46 miles of levees according to the current FEMA Midterm Levee Inventory.

## **Transportation**

### **AVIATION**

There are 72 National Plan of Integrated Airport Systems (NPIAS) Airports in North Carolina.

#### BRIDGES

- 2,308 of the 18,168 (12.7%) bridges in North Carolina are considered structurally deficient.
- 3,226 of the 18,168 (17.7%) bridges in North Carolina are considered functionally obsolete.
- North Carolina received \$110.4 million from the Federal Highway Bridge Fund in FY2011.

#### **INLAND WATERWAYS**

North Carolina has 1,150 miles of inland waterways, ranking it 7th in the nation.

## **PORTS**

North Carolina's ports handled 11 million short tons of cargo in 2012, ranking it 33rd in the nation.

#### KAIL

North Carolina has 22 freight railroads covering 3,245 miles across the state, ranking it 18th by mileage.

## **ROADS**

- North Carolina has 106.063 miles of public roads.
- · North Carolina has 11,268 miles of major roads, 11% of which are in poor condition.

## **Transit**

 North Carolina has 65.2 million annual unlinked passenger trips via transit systems – motor bus, heavy rail, light rail, and commuter rail.

# **Public Facilities**

## **PARKS AND RECREATION**

• North Carolina has reported an unmet need of \$1.44 billion for its parks system.

### **SCHOOLS**

- Public school districts in North Carolina spent a total of \$4 billion on capital outlays for school construction and acquisition of land and existing structures in fiscal years 2005–2008.
- It is estimated that North Carolina schools have \$9.8 billion in infrastructure funding needs.

### **ENERGY**

• North Carolina produces 6.840 gigawatt-hours of renewable energy every year, ranking it 13th.
