The Environmental Review Commission (ERC) will meet at 9:30 a.m. Wednesday 3 May 2006 and at 9:30 a.m. Monday 8 May 2006 in Room 544 of the Legislative Office Building in Raleigh.

At the 3 May and 8 May meetings, the Commission will continue studies for which the Commission is responsible, hear reports from State agencies, discuss topics to be considered at future meetings, and attend to other matters. Listed below are potential agenda topics for the meetings. More specific information regarding the agendas for the 3 May and 8 May meetings of the Commission will be developed at the staff planning meeting discussed below.

The Commission will resume a schedule of regular monthly meetings following adjournment of the 2006 Session of the General Assembly.
