COMMISSION MEETING - 11 April 2006:

The Environmental Review Commission (ERC) will meet at 9:30 a.m. Tuesday 11 April 2006 in Room 544 of the Legislative Office Building in Raleigh. The Commission will <u>not meet</u> on Wednesday 12 April 2006.

At the 11 April meeting, the Commission will begin or continue studies for which the Commission is responsible, hear reports from State agencies, discuss topics to be considered at future meetings, and attend to other matters. Listed below are potential agenda topics for this meeting. More specific information regarding the agenda for the 11 April meeting of the Commission will be developed at the staff planning meeting discussed below.
