

- Not strictly conservation



- 102 riparian buffer, stream and wetland restoration projects funded totaling over \$63,800,000






CWMTF Funded Projects

- Leveraged over \$906.9 million in public and private funds


Amount Funded - Primary Purpose






CWMTF Funded Projects 1997-2005



Amount Funded by Region (1997A-2005B)





Number of Projects Funded by River Basin (1997A-2005B)



Amount Funded by Applicant Type (1997A-2005B)







Local Government Funding

Numbers of Grants Made to Municipalities, Counties, Other Local Government Agencies

- 142 local governments assisted with wastewater improvements
- Over \$134.4 million invested to reduce spills from leaky sewers and to more effectively treat wastewater
- CWMTF has funded 49 stormwater treatment projects for a total of \$36.9 million






2005 Summary of Projects

2005 Project Highlights - Military Protection

CWMTF invested a total of \$12.3 million in clean water/military protection in 2005.

- •August Action:
 - –Six clean water/military protection projects
 - -All four major bases





2005 Project Highlights - Clarendon & Davis Tracts


- Protection of lower Cape Fear River in Brunswick County
- \$1.5 million CWMTF grant for easement on the Davis tract
- \$2.6 million grant for easement on the Clarendon tract
- CWMTF and NCCLT's partnership have protected 10,353 acres including much of Town Creek valued at \$74.4 million since 1997





2005 Project Highlights - Partnership with NCDPR

- CWMTF grants helped acquire Worlds Edge, the first tract for the new Hickory Nut Gorge State Park
- \$2,270,000 to help expand New River State Park in Ashe County
- \$720,000 to improve public access and help protect the Haw River in Chatham County





2005 Project Highlights - Mt. Island Lake

- \$639,000 grant to match local funds to address stormwater in Caldwell Station Creek in the Mountain Island Lake watershed
- Continuation of long partnership with Mecklenburg Co.





2006 Grant Cycles

- Spring Cycle currently under review
 - 135 new applications requesting over \$212.8 million
 - 16 deferred applications totaling \$31.7 million
- Fall Cycle closes June 1
