





Proposed Landfills in Eastern North Carolina



Riegel Ridge LLC- MSW

- Location- Columbus County
- Parent Company- Waste
 Management of the Carolinas,
 (Waste Management Inc.)
- 107 acre footprint, 20 year life
- 1500 tons per day
- Service area- 25 NC and 15 SC counties

Riegel Ridge Continued...

- Under Review for several years
- Section conducting compliance audit
- Awaiting wetlands permit from the Army Corps of Engineers
- Major technical and permitting issues satisfied for site study
- Site Suitability Letter to follow in the near future



Black Bear LLC, MSW

- Location- Camden County, on US 17 south of the VA state line
- Parent- Waste Industries USA Inc.
- 490 acre footprint, 30 year life
- → 10,000 tons per day
- ◆ Service area, East of I-75
- Anticipate barge waste to Norfolk and truck down US 17.

Black Bear LLC Continued

- Submitted in October of 2004
- Under Review
- Waste Industries will be a party to the permit, financial qualifications reasons
- Not yet officially on the application
- Need compliance audit
- Subject to legal action from City of Chesapeake, Va.



Alligator River Recycling LLC

Construction and Demolition Debris

Recycling and Treatment and Processing Facility with a Landfill

- Location- Hyde County, on the Intercoastal Waterway between the Alligator and Pungo Rivers
- ◆ 100 Acre Footprint, 3000 tons per day
- ◆ Service area- East of I-75
- Barge facility with recycling
- Company permitting barge facilities in Delaware and possibly Massachusetts.

Alligator River LLC Continued

- Currently under review
- Business structure being determined so that financial qualifications can be evaluated
- Needs compliance audit
- Barge facility undergoing Environmental Impact Assessment process for the Corps and CAMA
- Early in the permit process

North Carolina Resource Conservation and Recovery LLC

Industrial Treatment, Processing and Storage Unit for ASR (Auto Shredder Residue)

- Location- Navassa, Brunswick County
- Parent Sims Group USA Corp, formerly Hugo Neu
- 5000 tons per day for processing
- USA service area

NCRCR LLC Continued

- Sims recently acquired Hugo Neu
- Financial Qualifications and compliance audit to be performed
- Company working on wetland permits
- Preliminary hydrogeologic investigation underway.
- Navassa has confirmed the franchise and agreed to Sims being a party to the permit



Solid Waste Rulemaking - Construction and Demolition Debris Proposed Rules

15 A NCAC 13B .0531-.0547

- Rules for Construction and Demolition
 Debris proposed (Feb 15, 2006 publication in NC Register)
- Currently under the old, 1980's vintage, sanitary landfill rules
- Process began in 2000, after Hurricane Floyd
- Rules were proposed in 2003, withdrawn to revise in response to comments.

C&D Rule Making continued

- Revisions address the primary concern of continued operation of C&D units on top of old, closed MSW's
- Include provisions for public participation, updated environmental protections, waste acceptance criteria, closure and post-closure plans and funding

C&D on top of MSW

- Owners may continue the use of C&D's on top of MSW's if they meet the following:
- Obtain local government approval
- Prepare an Assessment of Corrective Action Plan under Section 1600.
- Update Operations, Closure and Post-closure Plans
- Post Financial Assurance
