Program Overview


- General Assembly establishes Million Acres Initiative in 1999
 - Requires permanent conservation measures
 - 10 years allowed to acquire additional million acres 1999 2009.

The Numbers

• 2005 Acre total 53,431 acres

• Total since January 1999 405,521 acres





- Loss of our Rural Heritage


Conservation Planning....
